BACKGROUND

The \$300,000 appropriated for this Bill represents a supplementary special grant fund for Fiscal Year 2026 from the State of Maryland Recovery Friendly Workplace program. The funding will support the creation of recovery friendly workplaces and care navigators. The Fiscal Year 2026 budget for the Mayor's Office of Employment Development was approved.

The Department of Finance Reported that the Mayor's Office of Employment Development received notice of a State grant following adoption of the Fiscal 2026 budget. The agency will receive \$494,038 through a three-year grant from the State of Maryland Recovery Friendly Workplace program (see allocation in the chart below). Council Bill 25-0109 seeks to appropriate the first year of this grant award; the remaining grant award will be appropriated in subsequent fiscal years.ⁱ

Fiscal Note:

Council Bill - Supplementary Special Grant Fund Operating Appropriation – Mayor's Office of Employment Development – \$300,000 will support the development of building a network of businesses designated as 'Recovery Friendly'. This program will specifically work to connect jobseekers to Recovery Friendly Advisors to assist them in their job search.

The Department of Finance Report indicates that MOED aims to onboard 45 "Recovery Friendly Workplaces" and provide to support 120 individuals through "Recovery Friendly" advisors. This budget covers the cost of 1 City position, supply and overhead. No local match is required for this grant. ⁱ

The Department of Finance is herein reporting on City Council Bill 25-00111, Supplementary State Fund Operating Appropriation –Mayor's Office of Employment Development – \$300,000, the purpose of providing funding for local employment agencies to build a network of businesses designated as 'Recovery Friendly' and provide for a network of advisors to support residents in recovery and businesses in the network.

Background

The Mayor's Office of Employment Development received notice of a State grant following adoption of the Fiscal 2026 budget. The agency will receive \$494,038 through a three-year grant from the State of Maryland Recovery Friendly Workplace program. This action seeks to appropriate the first year of this grant award; the remaining grant award will be appropriate in subsequent fiscal years.

Fiscal Impact

Through the Recovery Friendly Workplace grant, MOED will work to build a network of businesses designated as 'Recovery Friendly'. The program also connects jobseekers to Recovery Friendly Advisors to assist them in their job search.

Over the life of the grant, MOED is aiming to onboard 45 'Recovery Friendly Workplaces' and provide support to 120 individuals through 'Recovery Friendly' advisors. The budget covers the cost for 1 City position and the corresponding supply and overhead budget. There is no local match requirement for the grant.

The budget for the program for the duration of the grant is allocated as follows:

- Equipment \$3,150
- Stakeholder Convenings \$15,000

- Admin/Indirect Costs \$44,913

Conclusion

Approval of this supplemental appropriation will allow MOED to begin implementing the Recovery Friendly Workplace program. The funding will support staffing and program operations needed to establish partnerships with employers and provide employment support to individuals in recovery. This action ensures that the agency can fully utilize external grant funding to advance workforce inclusion and strengthen local employment opportunities without requiring additional City resources.

For the reasons stated above, the Department of Finance supports City Council Bill 25-0111.

Dear President and City Council Members:

The Law Department reviewed City Council Bill 25-0109 for form and legal sufficiency. The bill provides a Supplementary Special Grant Fund Operating Appropriation in the amount of \$300,000 to the Mayor's Office of Employment Development – Service 795 (Workforce Services for Baltimore Residents), to provide funding to support the creation of recovery friendly workplaces and care navigators. The money for this supplementary appropriation is from a grant from the State of Maryland in excess of the revenue relied on by the Board of Estimates in determining the tax levy required to balance the budget for Fiscal Year 2026. The grant could not have been expected with reasonable certainty when the Ordinance of Estimates for Fiscal Year 2026 was formulated. The bill would take effect on its date of enactment.

Section 8(b)(2)(ii) of Article VI of the City Chater provides:

Grants from private or governmental sources that could not be expected with reasonable certainty at the time of the formulation of the proposed Ordinance of Estimates may be made available to the appropriate municipal agency for expenditure by a supplementary appropriation ordinance recommended to the City Council by the Board of Estimates, duly passed by the City Council by a majority vote of its members and approved by the Mayor.

The ordinance must identify the source of the funds and may only involve a "single program, purpose, activity or project." City Charter, Art. VI, § 8(c). Council Bill 25-0109 satisfies these requirements. Since it meets these criteria, Law Department approves this bill for form and legal sufficiency.

BACKGROUND/EXPLANATION:

The Mayor's Office of Employment Development (MOED) has received a three-year grant from the State of Maryland through the Recovery Friendly Workplace program. This grant helps local employment agencies build a network of businesses designated as 'Recovery Friendly'. The program also connects jobseekers to Recovery Friendly Advisors to assist them in their job search.

Over the life of the grant, MOED is aiming to onboard 45 'Recovery Friendly Workplaces' and provide support to 120 individuals through 'Recovery Friendly' advisors. The budget covers the cost for 1 City position and the corresponding supply and overhead budget. There is no local match requirement for the grant.

The requested supplemental represents years one and two of the grant. The third (and final) portion of the grant will be included in MOED's Fiscal 2027 budget request. The total grant over the three-year period is \$494,038.

BILL SYNOPSIS

The Mayor's Office of Employment Development is herein reporting on City Council Bill 25-0109, Supplementary Fund 5000 Appropriation-Mayors Office of Employment Development - \$300,000, the purpose of which is to increase the Fiscal Year 2026 appropriation of Funds by \$300,000 to the Mayor's Office of Employment Development, Service: SRV0795 Workforce Services for Baltimore Residents.

SUMMARY OF POSITION

The Maryland Department of Labor currently has a Recovery-Friendly Workplace pilot (RFW) funding local areas to educate the business community about the benefits of providing resources for employees struggling with substance use disorders, and for jobseekers in recovery that have barriers to employment as a result of their previous struggles with substance use. MOED is currently on the policy advisory committee for this program and is implementing the RFW tenants.

Funding from the Recovery-Friendly Workplace pilot (RFW) Grant would allow MOED to better define how the job developer engages with the larger MOED business services team and to determine how we might best absorb this role into our WIOA funding while continuing to specialize in serving people in recovery and educating businesses on the RFW (Recovery-Friendly Workplaces).

The grant could not have been expected with reasonable certainty when the Ordinance of Estimates for Fiscal Year 2026 was formulated.

FISCAL IMPACT

Mayor's Office of Employment Development requires supplemental appropriation due to timing of the award as it relates to the city budget planning. The grant could not have been expected with reasonable certainty when the Ordinance of Estimates for Fiscal Year 2026 was formulated. This supplemental

appropriation of \$300,000 is necessary to accommodate these unbudgeted costs. The Funding from the for Recovery Friendly Workplace Grant will be used to cover these supplemental expenses.

CONCLUSION

This supplemental appropriation is required to authorize agency spending beyond the amount enacted in the Ordinance of Estimates and is necessary due to new revenue/programming for the Recovery Friendly Workplace.

For the reasons stated above, the Mayor's Office of Employment Development City Council Bill 25-0109, Supplementary Fund Appropriation- Mayors Office of Employment Development - \$300,000.
