3	FOR the purpose of supporting the intent of the United Steel Workers and the Metropolitan
4	Baltimore Council AFL-CIO Unions to maximize the creation of American jobs and restore
5	economic growth and opportunity by spending economic recovery plan funds on products
6	and services that both create jobs and help keep Americans employed.
7	WHEREAS, The economic downturn is having a critical impact on everyday Americans who
8	are struggling to maintain or find jobs in an increasingly difficult environment; and
9	WHEREAS, Those same Americans are the taxpayers that provide the revenue needed to
10	operate essential government services; and
11	WHEREAS, Congress and President Obama adopted a taxpayer-sponsored economic recovery
12	package that will provide billions of dollars to help economically devastated cities and states
13	immediately provide jobs to millions of out-of-work Americans through considerable
14	infrastructure rebuilding, green energy projects, and other projects that will require manufactured
15	components; and
16	WHEREAS, Our taxpayer dollars should be spent to maximize the creation of American jobs
17	and restore the economic vitality of our communities; and
18	WHEREAS, Any domestically produced products that are purchased with economic recovery
19	plan monies will immediately help struggling American families and will help stabilize our
20	greater economy; and,
21	WHEREAS, Any economic recovery plan spending should - to every extent possible - include
22	a commitment from Baltimore City to buy materials and goods produced within the United
23	States for projects, thus employing the very workers that pay taxes for the economic recovery
24	plan spending in the first place.
25	Now, therefore, be it resolved by the City Council of Baltimore, That the

Director of the Mayor's Office of Employment Development, the Director of Finance, the
Baltimore City Solicitor, the President of the United Steel Workers, the President of the
Metropolitan Baltimore Council of AFL-CIO Unions, and the Mayor's Legislative Liaison to the
City Council.
