## AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING

1	Sporting Events – Offenses Involving
2 3	For the purpose of modifying the penalties for certain offenses involving sporting events; and correcting, clarifying, and conforming related language.
4 5 6 7 8	By repealing and reordaining, with amendments Article 19 - Police Ordinances Section(s) 48-1 through 48-4 Baltimore City Code (Edition 2000)
9 10	SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:
11	Baltimore City Code
12	Article 19. Police Ordinances
13	Subtitle 48. Sporting Events
14	§ 48-1. Throwing missiles.
15	(a) "Missile" defined.
16 17	[As used in] IN this section, [the word] "missile" means any object [or thing] capable of being thrown or used as a projectile, but does not include empty paper wrappers.
18	(b) <i>Exclusions</i> .
19 20 21	This section [shall] DOES not apply to a member of a team or AN official participating as a principal in a sporting event while engaged in the course of conduct required by [such] THAT sporting event.

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS indicate matter added to existing law. [Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law. <u>Underlining</u> indicates matter added to the bill by amendment. Strike out indicates matter stricken from the bill by amendment or deleted from existing law by amendment.

1	(c) Prohibited conduct.
2 3	It [shall be] IS unlawful for any person [or persons] to toss, throw, fling, or project, or to cause the tossing, throwing, flinging, or projecting of any missile:
4 5	(1) [upon] ON or in the direction of any member of a team or official participating as a principal in a sporting event; or
6 7	(2) [upon] ON any playing field or arena during the course of [such] A SPORTING event.
8	(d) Penalties.
9 10 11 12	Any person [violating the provisions] WHO VIOLATES A PROVISION of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and, [upon] ON conviction [thereof], [shall be punished by] IS SUBJECT TO a fine of not more than [\$250] \$1,000 or [by] TO imprisonment for not more than [3] 12 months[,] or TO both [such] fine and imprisonment FOR EACH OFFENSE.
13	§ 48-3. Preakness Stakes tickets.
14	(a) Prohibited conduct.
15 16	[A person must not] IT IS UNLAWFUL FOR ANY PERSON TO offer for sale or resale or TO possess for sale or resale any Preakness Stakes ticket that:
17	(1) is forged or counterfeit; or
18 19	(2) is in any way printed or issued without the consent of the Maryland Jockey Club of Baltimore City, Inc.
20	(b) Penalties.
21 22	(1) Any person who violates A PROVISION OF this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and, on conviction, is subject to a fine of not more than \$1,000 for each offense.
23 24 25	(2) [A person may be charged with a separate offense for each] EACH ticket that [the person offers] IS OFFERED or [possesses] POSSESSED in violation of this section IS A SEPARATE OFFENSE.
26	§ 48-4. Flying over stadium.
27	(a) Prohibited conduct.
20	[A norgan shall not] IT IS INH AWELL FOR ANY DEDSON operate on aircraft over or around

[A person shall not] IT IS UNLAWFUL FOR ANY PERSON operate an aircraft over or around
the outer limits of [Memorial] M&T BANK Stadium or Oriole Park at Camden Yards for
any advertising or commercial purposes.

## 1 (b) Penalties.

Any [violation] PERSON WHO VIOLATES A PROVISION of this section IS GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR AND, ON CONVICTION, [shall be punishable by] IS SUBJECT TO a fine of not [less] MORE than \$1,000[, to be imposed upon any person who shall be found guilty of a violation of this section, said fine to be collected in the same manner as any other fine for the violation of other ordinances].

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance
are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior
Ordinance.

10 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30<sup>th</sup> day 11 after the date it is enacted.
