22	SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the
23	Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

26	SUBTITLE 5. "DUMPSTERS" AND SIMILAR CONTAINERS

1	§ 5-1. Definitions.
2	(A) IN GENERAL.
3	In this subtitle, the following terms have the meanings indicated.
4	(B) DIRECTOR.
5	"Director" means the Director of Public Works or the Director's designee.
6	(c) Dumpster.
7	"Dumpster" means any container that:
8	(1) IS USED OR DESIGNED TO BE USED FOR SOLID WASTE COLLECTION OR STORAGE; AND
10	(2) has a volume of at least 90 gallons or $\frac{1}{2}$ cubic yard.
11	(d) Person.
12	(1) "Person" means:
13	(I) AN INDIVIDUAL;
14 15	(II) A PARTNERSHIP, FIRM, ASSOCIATION, CORPORATION, OR OTHER ENTITY OF ANY KIND; OR
16 17	(III) A RECEIVER, TRUSTEE, GUARDIAN, PERSONAL REPRESENTATIVE, FIDUCIARY, OR REPRESENTATIVE OF ANY KIND.
18 19	(2) "Person" does not include a governmental entity or an instrumentality or unit of a governmental entity.
20	(e) Solid Waste.
21	"SOLID WASTE" MEANS:
22 23	(1) any garbage or mixed refuse, as those terms are define in \S 2-1 of this article; and
24 25	(2) ANY OTHER SOLID WASTE, AS THAT TERM IS DEFINED IN CITY HEALTH ARTICLE § 7-101.

1	§ 5-2. Rules and regulations.
2	(a) Director may adopt.
3 4	The Director may adopt and enforce rules and regulations to carry out this subtitle.
5	(B) FILING WITH LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE.
6 7	A copy of all rules and regulations must be filed with the Department of Legislative Reference before they take effect.
8	§§ 5-3 to 5-5. {Reserved}
9	§ 5-6. Registration required.
10	(A) IN GENERAL.
11	The owner of any dumpster to be used in the City must first register the dumpster with the Director.
13	(B) APPLICATION.
14	(1) THE REGISTRATION MUST BE MADE IN THE FORM THAT THE DIRECTOR REQUIRES.
15 16	(2) In addition to any other information that the Director requires, the registration must include:
17	(I) THE NAME, ADDRESS, AND TELEPHONE NUMBER OF THE OWNER;
18 19	(II) THE NAME, ADDRESS, AND TELEPHONE NUMBER OF ANY LESSEE OR OTHER PERSON WHO POSSESSES THE DUMPSTER; AND
20	(III) A DESCRIPTION OF THE DUMPSTER.
21	(C) Supplemental information.
22	The owner must report to the Director, within 30 days of the event:
23	(1) ANY NEWLY ACQUIRED DUMPSTER;
24 25	(2) THE TRANSFER OF OWNERSHIP, POSSESSION, OR LOCATION OF ANY REGISTERED DUMPSTER; AND
26	(3) ANY OTHER CHANGE IN THE REGISTRATION INFORMATION PROVIDED.

1	§ 5-7. TERM AND RENEWAL.
2	(A) TERM.
3 4	Each registration filed under this subtitle expires annually on December 31, unless renewed.
5	(B) RENEWAL.
6 7	The application for renewal of a registration must be made in the form that the Director requires.
8	§ 5-8. FEES.
9	(A) IN GENERAL.
10 11	(1) THE AMOUNT OF THE ANNUAL FEE FOR REGISTRATION IS AS SET FROM TIME TO TIME BY THE DIRECTOR, WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE BOARD OF ESTIMATES.
12 13	(2) The fee so set may include an appropriate differential based on size and material
14	(B) FEE FOR LESS THAN FULL YEAR.
15	The annual fee for less than a full initial year is prorated quarterly.
16	(c) Fees not refundable.
17 18	No refunds, in whole or in part, may be made of any registration fees required by this subtitle.
19	§§ 5-9 to 5-10. {Reserved}
20	§ 5-11. Markings on dumpster.
21	(a) Required displays.
22	EACH DUMPSTER MUST DISPLAY, AT ALL TIMES:
23	(1) A CURRENT REGISTRATION MEDALLION ISSUED BY THE DIRECTOR; AND
24 25	(2) ON A SIDE EXPOSED TO PUBLIC VIEW, IN LETTERING AT LEAST 3" HIGH, THE NAME, ADDRESS, AND TELEPHONE NUMBER OF ITS OWNER.
26	(B) Advertising prohibited.
27 28 29	EXCEPT AS REQUIRED BY SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION OR AS OTHERWISE AUTHORIZED BY A RULE OR REGULATION ADOPTED UNDER THIS SUBTITLE, NO ADVERTISING MAY APPEAR ON A DUMPSTER

1	§ 5-12. Using unregistered dumpster.
2	NO PERSON MAY USE ANY DUMPSTER THAT:
3	(1) HAS NOT BEEN REGISTERED UNDER THIS SUBTITLE; OR
4 5	(2) DOES NOT DISPLAY THE MEDALLION AND OTHER INFORMATION REQUIRED BY THIS SUBTITLE.
6	§ 5-13. Placement in right-of-way.
7 8	No person may place any dumpster on a street, sidewalk, or other public right-of-way except:
9	(1) momentarily, as necessary while the dumpster is being emptied; or
10 11 12	(2) IN STRICT ACCORDANCE WITH A MINOR PRIVILEGE PERMIT ISSUED FOR THAT PURPOSE, THE TERMS OF WHICH ARE PROMINENTLY DISPLAYED ON THE DUMPSTER IN THE MANNER THAT THE DIRECTOR SPECIFIES.
13	§§ 5-14 to 5-15. {Reserved}
14	§ 5-16. Impounding dumpsters in violation.
15	(A) IN GENERAL.
16 17 18	For any dumpster found to be unregistered, or in a public right-of-way without or in violation of a minor privilege permit, or otherwise in violation of this subtitle, the D irector may:
19 20	(1) CAUSE THE DUMPSTER TO BE SUMMARILY TOWED TO AND IMPOUNDED AT SOME SUITABLE STORAGE AREA; OR
21 22	(2) SEND WRITTEN NOTICE THE PERSONS THOUGHT TO BE RESPONSIBLE, ORDERING THE DUMPSTER'S REMOVAL WITHIN THE TIME SPECIFIED IN THE NOTICE .
23	(B) Costs and expenses.
24 25 26	(1) Any person who uses or places a dumpster in violation of this subtitle is liable to the City for the costs of its towing and storing under this section.
27 28	(2) These costs are as set by the Director from time to time, with the approval of the Board of Estimates.

1	§ 5-17. Enforcement by citation.
2	(A) IN GENERAL.
3 4	In addition to any other civil or criminal remedy or enforcement procedure, this subtitle may be enforced by issuance of:
5 6	(1) AN ENVIRONMENTAL CITATION UNDER CITY CODE ARTICLE 1, SUBTITLE 40 {"Environmental Control Board"}; or
7 8	(2) A CIVIL CITATION UNDER CITY CODE ARTICLE 1, SUBTITLE 41 {"CIVIL CITATIONS"}.
9	(B) Process not exclusive.
10 11	The issuance of a citation to enforce this subtitle does not preclude pursuing any other civil or criminal remedy or enforcement action authorized by law.
12	§ 5-18. Penalties.
13	(A) IN GENERAL.
14 15 16	Any person who violates any provision of this subtitle or of a rule or regulation adopted under this subtitle is guilty of a misdemeanor and, on conviction, is subject to a fine of not more than $$1,000$ for each offense.
17	(B) EACH DAY A SEPARATE OFFENSE.
18	EACH DAY THAT A VIOLATION CONTINUES IS A SEPARATE OFFENSE.
