Major Issues Discussed

1. BCYF's Financial Management and Operations

- Clean FY23 audit results with no compliance issues or material weaknesses
- Reduction in administrative costs by 27% while increasing program expenses
- Current administrative infrastructure readiness increased from 4% to 72%
- 92% compliance rate among grantees, up from 30% previously

2. New Funding Announcements

- \$8 million in new investments announced, including:
 - \$500,000 for youth sports initiatives with City Schools
 - \$6 million for Youth Works summer jobs program
 - \$1.5 million for the Mayor's summer youth engagement initiative

3. Grant-Making Approach and Impact

- Portfolio of over 100 organizations serving 17,000+ youth
- \$32 million awarded since 2020
- 80% of grants are multi-year
- Four funding mechanisms: Grassroots Fund (64%), Community Accountable Fund (8%), Aligned Grant-Making Fund (15%), and President's Fund (12%)
- Focus on supporting small, Black and Brown-led grassroots organizations

4. Capacity Building and Technical Assistance

- Dual investment approach: 75% direct grants, 25% technical assistance
- Over 700 participants engaged in 100+ hours of professional development
- Learning Lab program with 95% of participants reporting skill advancement
- Pre-application technical assistance making applicants five times more likely to secure funding

5. Proposed Youth Master Plan

- First-ever comprehensive youth plan for Baltimore
- Expected timeline of 1.5-2 years for development
- Youth-centered approach modeled after New Orleans' plan
- Focus on city-wide collaboration and youth leadership
