Dear Council President Young:

On February 22, 2012 the Baltimore City Council introduced the above-captioned resolution, regarding the dedication of revenue from the Beverage Container Tax to the Public School Construction and Renovation Special Fund., for the specific purposes of school construction and capital projects.

Baltimore City Public Schools' (City Schools) facilities are in a state of woeful disrepair. The current backlog for school construction and renovation has been estimated at anywhere from \$1 billion to as much as \$2.8 billion in order to create a more suitable, healthier and more supportive learning environment for our children. High quality school facilities have a measurable, positive impact on student learning, attendance and graduation.

Any dedicated, consistent and predictable revenue sources provided by Baltimore City can be leveraged to produce significant funds targeted at City Schools' facility issues. City Schools therefore welcomes the identification of any resources dedicated to school construction and/or renovation; we trust that Baltimore City has identified those resources that best fit within its financial framework.

City Schools will support this effort, and we will gladly testify to that extent. Thank you for inviting us to participate in this process.
