Major Issues Discussed

- 1. <u>Chairwoman Porter</u> gave opening remarks and stated, "We need an all-hands-on deck approach. This is the opportunity to have a conversation regarding the quality of services provided."
- 2. <u>Vice President Middleton</u> also gave opening remarks and stated, "This is one of the most important issues to start conversations about! We must strengthen community trust." Other topics of her discussion included:
 - o The importance of having adequate clinics for recovery
 - o We want a more resilient society!
 - o Talked about the demographics of the 6th district stating there are a lot of middle-class residents living there
 - o As a result of the new laws, whereas the city had to accept group homes, the community associations became closer together!
 - She talked about some of the new organizations and stated, "there were drastic changes in the community as a result of the new organizations.
 - o Talked about the impact that "deaths and addiction" have in families; affects a lot of families, she said.
 - Drug addiction is a disease, and it is affecting everyone!
 - o Oversight is so, so important, she said!
 - There are some bad clinics out there!
 - The importance of educating the community
 - We must learn where the clinics are in order to manage our district(s)
 - Talked about the role of the Board of Municipal and Zoning Appeals (BMZA)
- 3. <u>President Zeke Cohen</u> also gave opening remarks and stated, "We appreciate these series of hearings! This is a very complex issue to wrap our arms around! We cannot incarcerate our way out of this issue. We must wrap our arms around this issue! Other topics of discussion included:
 - Comments regarding "Predatory Businesses"
 - The importance of having residents living and thriving in the city.
- 4. <u>Public Testimony</u> was taken (approximately six [6] speakers). Some comments, topics of discussion and/or concerns were:
 - Concerns:
 - Open air drug market in Westport is of concern and is mainly coming from people living in surrounding counties!
 - o It affects the quality of life for residents!
 - Must make sure funding goes where it is needed! The right way through oversight!
 - We need better partnerships, collaboration, solutions and outcomes!
 - Comments:
 - Much prayer is needed!
 - Some clinics are exploiting their clients!
 - o Those clinics must be investigated and shut down!
 - This is not just an agency(s) issue but an issue for the city as well.
 - Is a homeless specialist

- o Knows how "deep" this issue goes!
- o There are challenges being homeless while getting treatment.
- We need our "boots" on the ground to confront this issue!
- Importance of data sharing
- Importance of outreach
- The representative from Sinai Hospital stated that she was in attendance to share information about their program at the hospital. She talked about:
 - o Makeup of customers
 - Age, race, etc.
 - Importance of meeting people where they are
 - Accessibility of services is crucial!
 - The goal is making the best decisions possible!
- 5. Each representative from both the Behavioral Health Administration Baltimore and the Powell Recovery Center, Inc. gave a PowerPoint Presentation. Copies are on file.
- 6. Committee/council members asked questions, stated concerns, and made comments. Some highlighted topics of discussion, comments and/concerns were:
 - o Equity and Quality
 - Chairwoman Porter explained why she asked Ms. Wireman to submit some recommendations
 - A committee member thanks Ms. Wireman for the recommendations and stated,
 "We want to make sure people on the front line are doing and/or is providing adequate services."
 - o Recovery Homes must be licensed
 - Health and safety standards in those homes are very important!
 - Oversight
 - Explain what is certified versus non-certified Requested by Committee member Ramos: please submit the answer in writing.
 - o Concerns:
 - Clients get the proper services needed
 - Adequate licensing for all treatment centers
 - o Clients Served
 - Do you have data for how many of the clients served in the city are actually city residents?
 - Do we have a sense of services the city is providing for clients living in surrounding counties?
 - Requested by Councilmember Zac Blanchard: Provide a breakdown of the number of clients being served in city who live in the surrounding counties.
 - Substance Use Disorder (SUD) Clinics
 - Talk about the programs you provide and how it fits into communities
 - Talk about community engagement and consideration
 - Language barriers
 - o What barriers have you seen for getting treatment for the immigrant community?
 - Oversight Bad and/or Illegal Clinics
 - Concern: There is a deep need for services in the City but a "quality of services provided" <u>issue</u> which makes drug issues worse. We don't mind if quality clinics are opening within community! Most clients don't know a good vs. bad clinic!

- Concern: Below standard clinics and addressing those illegal facilities
 - o We must look into how the Council can help constituents in his/her district!
 - o Having a clinic half block from an open-air drug market is not good!
 - o There are not enough penalties for not being certified!
 - o Those type clinics are "allowable but not desirable!"
 - o What is considered an uncertified recovery home?
 - o Suggestion: Would I be helpful if we (the community) begin to collect data on these illegal clinics? Answer: Yes
- 7. Chairwoman Porter gave closing remarks, "We must transform people to healing! This issue touches so many and it will take all of us to assist!"
- 8. Hearing recessed.
