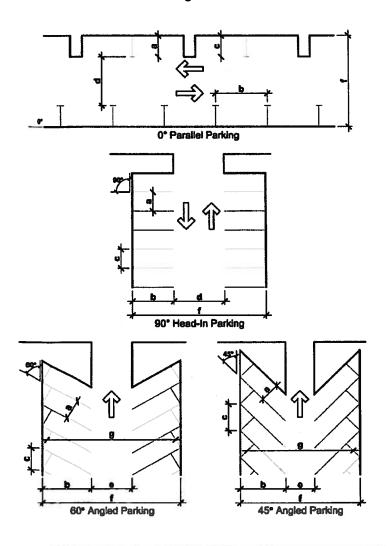
Table 15-405: Mount Vernon Neighborhood Height Map
