Re: **City Council Bill 11-0714 - Baltimore City Landmark List - Waverly Town Hall**

The Department of Housing and Community Development has reviewed City Council Bill 11-0714, which was introduced for the purpose of designating Waverly Town Hall, 3100 Greenmount Avenue (Block 3881, Lot 10/12), as a historical landmark.

This bill would designate the "Waverly Town Hall," located at 3100 Greenmount Avenue (Block 3881, Lot 10/12), as a Baltimore City Landmark. The Commission for Historical and Architectural Preservation (CHAP) has indicated that the building meets the City's Landmark designation criteria.
