12	SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That, in
13	accordance with Article V, § 5(b) of the City Charter, the City Comptroller may sell, at either
14	public or private sale, all the interest of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore in the property
15	known as the Pennington Avenue Landfill (Block 7165, Lots 4A, 38, 38A, 40, 41, 42, 43, 44, 45,
16	and 46), and more particularly described as follows:
17	The subject parcel, the Pennington Avenue Landfill (Block 7165, Lots 4A, 38,
18	38A, 40, 41, 42, 43, 44, 45, and 46), is an unimproved lot containing
19	approximately 61 acres, located near the southern boundary line of Baltimore City
20	and Anne Arundel County.
21	This property being no longer needed for public use.
22	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That no deed may pass under this Ordinance
23	unless the deed has been approved by the City Solicitor.
