6	and of nuisances; making the registered owner of a vehicle responsible for certain parking,		
7	keeping, and storing violations; and generally relating to the enforcement of the Building,

25 26	The additions, deletions, amendments, and other modifications adopted by the City are as follows:		

1	Chapter 1. Administration				
2	Section 114 Stop-Work Order				
3	114.2 Issuance. The stop-work order must be in writing AND STATE THE REASON FOR THE				
4	ORDER. It must be [sent by first class and certified mail to the owner of the property involved,				
5	and hand delivered to the owner's agent or to the person doing the work. A copy of the stop-				
6	work order must be] posted on the property. On posting [of the stop-work order], the cited work				
7	must immediately cease. [The stop-work order must state the reason for the order.] WRITTEN				
8	NOTICE OF THE STOP-WORK ORDER MUST BE SENT BY FIRST CLASS AND CERTIFIED MAIL TO THE				
9	OWNER OF THE PROPERTY INVOLVED.

3	1. MAY ENFORCE THE VIOLATION NOTICE OR CONDEMNATION NOTICE BY ISSUANCE OF AN

5	{"Environmental Control Board"},				
6	2. [1.] may take whatever OTHER action is necessary and proper, including the institution of				
17	legal proceedings, to compel compliance with the VIOLATION notice, CONDEMNATION				
8	NOTICE, or citation or to enforce the penalty provisions of this Code, and				
9	3. [2.] subject to the notice requirements of § 123.8.1, may proceed to repair, rebuild,				
20	demolish, or take any other action necessary to eliminate, in whole or in part, or make				
21 22	safe any nuisance, blight, health hazard, or dangerous, insanitary, or unsafe condition that is the subject of the violation notice, condemnation notice, or citation.				
23	Chapter 33. Safeguards During Construction				
24	Section 3302 Construction Safeguards [{As in IBC}]				
25	3302.1 Remodeling and additions. Required exits, existing structural elements, fire				
26	protection devices, and sanitary safeguards [shall] MUST be maintained at all times during				
27	remodeling, alterations, repairs, or additions to any building or structure.				
28	Exceptions:				
29	1. When [such] THESE required elements or devices are THEMSELVES being				
30	remodeled, altered, or repaired, adequate substitute provisions [shall] MUST be				
31	made.				
32	2. [When] THESE REQUIREMENTS DO NOT APPLY IF the existing building is not				
33	occupied.				
34	3302.2 [Manner of removal.] Waste and debris. All sites for new construction of				
35	FOR REMODELING, ALTERATIONS, REPAIRS, OR ADDITIONS, AND ALL ABUTTING SIDEWALKS,

GUTTERS, AND ALLEYS, MUST BE PROPERLY MAINTAINED AND KEPT FREE OF ACCUMULATED

2 3	TRASH, GARBAGE, WASTE, OR DEBRIS, INCLUDING CONSTRUCTION WASTE OR DEBRIS, AND OF ANY OBJECT OR CONDITION THAT CONSTITUTES A NUISANCE. [Waste materials shall be				
4	removed] Removal of all trash, garbage, waste, and debris must be done in a				
5	manner [which] THAT prevents injury or damage to persons, adjoining properties, and public				
6	rights-of-way.				
7	Part VII. International Property Maintenance Code				
8	§ 7-102. City modifications.				
9	The additions, deletions, amendments, and other modifications adopted by the City are				
10	as follows:				
11	Chapter 3. General Requirements				
12	Section 305 Exterior Sanitary Maintenance – General				
13 14	305.5 Motor vehicles and trailers. Except only as otherwise expressly authorized by law, the following rules apply to all motor vehicles and trailers.				
15	1. No motor vehicle or trailer may be parked, kept, or stored, whether or not covered, on				
16	any exterior premises if:				
17	a. it is inoperative, unregistered, or fails to display current registration tags, or				
18 19	b. it is in a state of disassembly or disrepair or in the process of being stripped or dismantled.				
20	2. A motor vehicle or trailer may be parked, kept, or stored only on a dustless all-weather				
21	surface constructed and maintained in accordance with the Building Code and Zoning				
22	Code of Baltimore City.				
23	3. Painting a motor vehicle or trailer is prohibited unless conducted inside an approved				
24	spray booth.				
25	Exception: On premises with a proper use permit, a vehicle may undergo overhaul,				
26	including body work, if that work is performed inside a structure or similarly enclosed area				
27	designed and approved for that purpose.				
28	305.5.1 REGISTERED OWNER RESPONSIBLE. FOR A MOTOR VEHICLE OR TRAILER PARKED,				
29	KEPT, OR STORED IN VIOLATION OF § $305.5(1)$ or (2), the registered owner of the motor				
30	VEHICLE OR TRAILER IS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE VIOLATION, JOINTLY AND SEVERALLY WITH THE				
31	PROPERTY OWNER.				
32	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance				
33	are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior				
34	Ordinance.
