1 2	(2) Funds encumbered for contracts, projects, or other actual commitments and funds dedicated by any act of Congress, [or] by ANY State OR CITY law, or by the terms of
3	any private grant to some specific purpose shall be carried over to the next fiscal year.
4	(3) All appropriations not so carried over shall lapse at the end of the fiscal year from
5	which made, except that any balance remaining in the fund of the water or sanitary
6	wastewater utility (under [Section] § 18 of this article) at the end of the fiscal year
7 8	shall remain to the credit of that utility and an estimate of [such a] THAT balance shall be included in that utility's budget for the next year as an estimated receipt.
