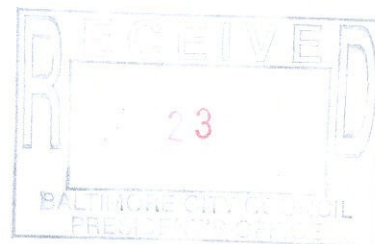
RE: Bill No. 11-0714 Baltimore City Landmark List: "Waverly Town Hall"
