I am herein reporting on City Council Bill 08-0238 introduced by Council President Rawlings Blake on behalf of the Administration (Department of Public Works).

The purpose of the Bill is to condemn and close (1) a 10-foot alley laid out in the rear of the properties formerly known as Nos. 2203-2227 North Howard Street and (2) a 10-foot alley laid out contiguous to the north outline of the property formerly known as No. 2214 Mace Street, as shown on Plat 114-A-47A in the Office of the Department of Public Works.

Carroll Independent Fuel wishes to incorporate these "paper" alleys with property they own, and consolidate the properties into one lot. City Council Bill 08-0238 and companion legislation (City Council Bills 08-0237 and 08-0239), if approved, would open and close these alleys to public use and authorize their sale.

The portions of rights-of-way proposed to be condemned and closed are as follows:

- An approximately 10 foot wide by 50 foot long alley located perpendicular to and between Mace Street and a 10-foot alley; and
- An approximately 10 foot wide by 176 foot long portion of an alley located perpendicular to and between West 23rd Street and the north property line of 2205 North Howard Street.

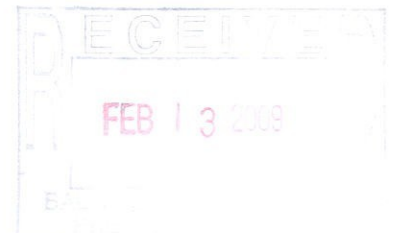
Any City-owned utilities not to be abandoned or relocated are protected by Sections 3 and 4 of the legislation.

Based on these findings, the Department of Public Works supports passage of City Council Bill 08-0238.
