3 FOR the purpose of designating the Johnny Eck House, 622 North Milton Avenue, as a historical  
4 landmark.

10 **SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE,** That the  
11 Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

13 **Article 6. Historical and Architectural Preservation**

14 **Subtitle 12. Landmark List 2000s**

15 **§ 12-20. JOHNNY ECK HOUSE.**

16 JOHNNY ECK HOUSE, 622 NORTH MILTON AVENUE.

17 **SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance  
18 are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior  
19 Ordinance.

20 **SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30<sup>th</sup> day  
21 after the date it is enacted.
