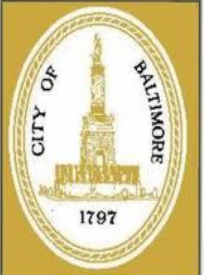

I am herein reporting on City Council Resolution 21-0005R introduced by Council Members Stokes, Glover, Middleton, Bullock, Cohen, and McCray.

The purpose of the Resolution is to request that the Department of General Services (DGS) provide the City Council with an update on how employees of DGS have been keeping City-owned buildings clean during the COVID-19 pandemic and post information about cleaning schedules in these buildings.

The Department of Public Works has been requested to report on how our facilities are being cleaned and sanitized in response to the possible presence of the COVID-19 virus in specific workplaces. We follow a strict protocol for reporting areas and vehicles that require COVID-19 sanitizing through WebEOC, which in turn allows for the use of DGS contractors to perform the work. The requests include specific information on the location of the area to be sanitized or vehicle information and location, agency contact information, the date when the COVID case or cases were last in the workspace or vehicle, and a Budget Account Number. These sanitizing requests include our offices in buildings under the control of DGS, facilities under the control of our Department, and vehicles assigned and leased to our Department by DGS Fleet.

Representatives of the Department of Public Works will attend the hearing on City Council Resolution 21-0047R to answer any questions the Council may have on this topic.
