5	civil rights legacy.
6	WHEREAS, Preserve America is a White House initiative developed in cooperation with the
7 8	Advisory Council on Historic Preservation, the U.S. Department of the Interior, and the U.S. Department of Commerce; and
9	WHEREAS, The goals of this initiative include a greater shared knowledge about our
10	Nation's past, strengthened regional identities and local pride, increased local participation in
11	preserving the country's irreplaceable cultural and natural heritage assets, and support for the
12	economic vitality of communities; and
13	WHEREAS, The <i>Preserve America</i> grant program can assist Baltimore's interests and goals
14	related to historic preservation; and
15	WHEREAS, The Baltimore Heritage Area is coordinating efforts to interpret the life of
16	Baltimore native Thurgood Marshall, the first African American justice on the Supreme Court of
17	the United States and the architect of the end of legalized segregation in the United States; and
18	WHEREAS, Many other Baltimoreans, including Lillie Mae Carroll Jackson, Clarence M.
19	Mitchell, Jr., and Parren J. Mitchell, have made significant contributions to advance civil rights
20	in the United States.
21	Now, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the City
22	Council hereby supports the grant application for <i>Preserve America</i> funds to assist the
23	completion of background research and documentation for the interpretation of the life of
24	Thurgood Marshall and Baltimore's civil rights legacy.
