Major Issues Discussed

Budget Hearing — June 4, 2024

- 1. The May 16th hearing (Budget Overview) was called to recess and reconvened on June 4, 2024.
- 2. A PowerPoint presentation was given by BCPS. A copy of the presentation is on file. Some highlighted comments and/or topics of discussion were:
 - * Talked about equity, accomplishments and feedback from community and schools
 - * Enterprise Fund is funded by U.S. Agriculture (Food provided to students)
 - * Received Post Funding for COVID
 - * There are more eligible children this school year than last school year; take this as a positive sign!
 - * There is a Psychiatrist and School Nurse in every school
- 3. The committee/council members asked questions, stated concerns, asked for clarification, and etc. Some highlights of same were:
 - o Glad to see:
 - The increase in teachers' salaries
 - Increase in community engagement
 - o Crossing Guards:
 - Glad to see you are hiring more guards
 - Do you have a partnership with the Department of Transportation?
 - o Concern: Traffic
 - Potential: Students being hit by a car/vehicle, how are you addressing this?
 - O Concern: CEO Contract
 - The CEO currently does not have a contract!
 - What is the status of the CEO Contract?
 - Would like to know where her contract is!
 - This is not the time to switch leadership!
 - Your leadership is extremely important!
 - Comment: Think you should get another contract but feel you need to at look your leadership cabin! Need a conversation about this!
 - Early Childhood Education
 - How do you think we can get to universal kindergarten for 4 years old and maybe 3 years old?
 - o Body Cameras for School Police
 - Where are you with this?
 - Comments regarding accountability, training and the possibility of a pilot program for cameras
 - School Police
 - Adequate Training is of concern
 - Have you audited overtime for the School Police? Requested by Councilmember Torrence: Please provide an update for same by August 30, 2024
 - Requested by Councilmember Middleton: Proved an updated list for the Judy Centers and where each center is located

O Violence Intervention

- Make sure the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between MONSE and the schools is taken care of!
- Violence due to social platforms (social media, Instagram, etc.) is of concern
 - What can we do to address this issue?
- Students' Safety After School Hours
 - Comments regarding employees going beyond their duties to help students
 - Comment regarding a Dunkin Donut Business that recently opened near/in a school area, "don't' know how it got approved!"
 - All agencies must work together for the safety of our students!
- o Comments regarding Restorative Practices and the importance of thereof!
- English Language Learners
 - There is an increased demand for same and an assessment for this demand is needed – talk about this!
 - Not enough Interpreters is of concern
 - Testing methods is of concern
- Enterprise Fund Meals in School
 - Is there a connection with any of the urban farms near schools? Answer: Yes, will provide a list for same.
- Curfews
 - Would like a commitment for having supervision for students 15 minutes before school hours and 15 minutes after school hours!
 - Comment regarding "School Police" passing the buck for keeping students out of school doing certain hours; accountability is important!
- o 21st Century Buildings comments
 - Overcrowding in schools is of concern
 - Blight buildings is of concern
 - Requested by Councilmember Cohen: Provide an update, when possible for the plans to address blight buildings
- Cell Phones
 - We need a citywide ban for cell phones in schools!
- o Apprenticeship Programs
 - Needs to be more formalized!
 - What is the plan to make the pathways more formalized?
- o Drop-Out Rate is of concern
- o Concern: That students who really need help get it! (Dollars/concentrated poverty)
- o Comment: Cameras are needed in every school!
- o Hall Monitors the importance of monitors in every school
- o Douglas High School
 - Would like to understand the current challenges at the school! Requested by Councilmember Torrence: Would like a briefing regarding same.
- o Digital Harbor
 - School intervention at Digital Harbor talk about the MOU for same
