AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING

1	Pawndrokers – Dealers in Second-Hand Property, etc. – Daily Reports
2	For the purpose of requiring authorizing the daily reports of pawnbrokers and of dealers in
3	second-hand property, antiques, and consignment goods to contain certain photographs;
4	requiring daily reports to be made electronically; requiring photographs to be submitted of certain items on "additional police hold"; conforming, correcting, and clarifying certain
5 6	language; providing for a special effective date; and generally relating to the reporting
7	requirements for pawnbrokers and for dealers in second-hand property, antiques, and
8	consignment goods.

22	legible and accurate manner on forms supplied by] SUBMIT TO the Police
23	Commissioner [of Baltimore City.] A DAILY REPORT [a list] of ALL articles taken on

9	THE DAILY REPORT SHALL INCLUDE:		
0	(1) the date, place, and time of each transaction;		
1	(2) the name and address of principal, if the transaction is by an agent;		
2	(3) a description of the transacted item, including:

14	(ii) its manufacturer, model number, year of manufacture if known, and/or soundex number or unique identifying number found on said property;

17 18	(iv) for jewelry, a description by weight if payment is based on weight, style, gender, number of stones, configuration of stones, any initials or distinguishing marks or inscriptions;		
20 21	(v) a statement of whether it appears to have been altered by any means, including:

24	(C) recutting a gem; and

9 10	(6) (7) [(6)] the signature of the person from whom the item is acquired and the signature of the pawnbroker or dealer who accepted the item.

13 14 15	(1) A pawnbroker shall submit [a copy of] each [transaction] DAILY REPORT to the [Pawnshop Unit of the Baltimore City] Police Department [by] IN TWO THE FOLLOWING FORMATS:

23	(B) WHEN.
24 25	[(1) delivering the copy by 10 a.m. on the next business day after the transaction is made; or
26	(2) mailing the copy at the end of the business day when the transaction is made.]
27 28	(1) The electronic report shall be submitted before 10 a.m. <u>noon</u> on the business day immediately following the day for which the report is made.
29	(2) THE WRITTEN REPORT SHALL BE SUBMITTED BY:
30 31	(I) MAILING THE REPORT AT THE END OF THE BUSINESS DAY FOR WHICH THE REPORT IS MADE; OR

8	(1) After the initial holding period required by subsection (a) of this section, <u>A PAWNBROKER SHALL CONTINUE TO HOLD A TRANSACTION ITEM IF:</u>

32	A pawnbroker shall release to the [primary law enforcement agency] POLICE		
33	DEPARTMENT any item [of property] IN THE PAWNBROKER'S POSSESSION[, other than a		
34	security or printed evidence of indebtedness, located at the place of business of the		
35	pawnbroker] if:		
36	(1) the item is established to be stolen;		
37	(2) the owner of the item or the victim of the theft has:		

1	(i) positively identified the item; [or] AND		
2 3	(ii) provided an affidavit of ownership [and] OR PREVIOUSLY made a report of the theft to a law enforcement agency; [and]		
4	(3) the stolen property report describes the item by:

16	§ 12-7. Daily reports required.		
17	(a) In general.		
18 19 20	(1) Each dealer shall [cause to be written in a legible and accurate manner on forms supplied by] SUBMIT TO the Police Commissioner[,] a daily report [for] OF each transaction in which a person transfers items to the dealer on that day.		
21 22	(2) The dealer shall forward the daily report to the Police Department, as provided in § 12-8 of this subtitle.		
23	(b) Scope of reports.		
24 25	Except as provided in this subtitle, the daily report shall contain the information specified in subsection (c) of this section for:		
26	(1) each item transferred; or		
27	(2) each group of substantially similar items transferred as part of 1 transaction.		

1	(c) Information required.
2	The daily report shall [contain the following information] INCLUDE:
3 4	(1) the date, place, and time of each transaction, including the location where the dealer purchased or received the item or group of items;
5	(2) a description of the item or group of items, including:
6	(i) the specific type and number of items;
7 8	(ii) the manufacturer, model number, and year of manufacture, if known, and any soundex number or unique identifying number found on the item;
9	(iii) the color, size, style, and approximate age;
10 11 12 13	(iv) for jewelry (other than costume jewelry meeting standards set by the Police Commissioner), a description by weight (if payment is based on weight), style, gender, number and configuration of stones, and any initials or distinguishing marks or inscriptions;
14 15	(v) a statement of whether or not the item appears to have been altered by any means, including:
16	(A) obscuring a serial number or identifying feature;
17	(B) melting; or
18	(C) recutting a gem; and
19	(vi) the amount paid or other consideration;
20	(3) for each individual from whom the dealer acquires an item:
21 22	(i) the individual's name, date of birth, and license number from a clearly identifiable driver's license;
23	(ii) identification information about the individual that:
24 25 26 27	(A) positively identifies the individual from at least 2 forms of identification, which may include an age of majority card, military identification, passport, or other similar photographic identification; and
28 29 30	(B) provides a physical description of the individual, including the sex, race, date of birth, any distinguishing features, and weight of the individual; or

2 3 4	(A) the dealer has known the transferor of the item for 10 years or longer and knows that the transferor has lived at his/her current residence for not less than 3 years;
5 6	(B) that the specific information required by subitems (i) or (ii) of this item (3) is retained in the dealer's records; and
7 8	(C) that a record of the transaction signed by the individual from whom the item is acquired is retained in the dealer's records;
9 10 11	(4) if the individual from whom the dealer acquires the item is acting as an agent for a principal, the same information for the principal as that which is required by item (3) of this subsection to be given for the agent;
12 13	(5) a statement indicating whether or not the person making the transfer is personally known to the dealer;
14	(6) A PHOTOGRAPH OF THE ITEM OR ITEMS; and
15 16 17	(6) (7) [(6)] the signature of the dealer who accepted the item and, except for a transaction reported under item (3)(iii) of this subsection, the signature of the individual from whom the item is acquired.
18	§ 12-8. Filing with police.
19	(a) [In general.] How.
20 21	(1) A dealer shall submit each daily report to the Police Department [by] IN TWO THE FOLLOWING FORMATS:
22 23	(1) (1) BY ELECTRONIC TRANSMITTAL, IN THE FORMAT AND MANNER REQUIRED BY THE POLICE COMMISSIONER; AND
24 25 26	(II) (2) IF THE ELECTRONIC TRANSMISSION IS NOT SUBMITTED WITH AN ELECTRONIC SIGNATURE ACCEPTABLE TO THE POLICE COMMISSIONER, IN WRITING, ON THE FORMS SUPPLIED BY THE POLICE COMMISSIONER.

3 0 3 1	[(1) delivering the report or electronically transmitting a facsimile of it before 10 a.m. on the business day immediately following the day for which the report is made; or
32	(2) mailing the report at the end of the business day for which the report is made.]
33 34	(1) THE ELECTRONIC REPORT SHALL BE SUBMITTED BEFORE 10 A.M. NOON ON THE BUSINESS DAY IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWING THE DAY FOR WHICH THE REPORT IS MADE.

11 12	(c) Additional holding period.
13 14	(1) After the [retention] INITIAL HOLDING period [specified] REQUIRED by subsection (a) of this section, a dealer shall continue to hold [any] AN item if:
15 16	(i) a law enforcement officer requests that the dealer hold the item;
17 18 19	(ii) the law enforcement officer has reasonable cause to believe the item has been stolen; and
20 21	(iii) the item has not been identified under § 12-10(a)(2) of this subtitle.
222324	(2) [Any] If AN item IS placed on additional police hold under this subsection, THE DEALER shall:
25	(I) [be held by the dealer] CONTINUE TO HOLD THE ITEM until:
26 27	(A) [(i)] the police seize [the item] IT;
28 29 30	(B) [(ii)] the Police Department releases the police hold or directs the item to be released to [the] ITS owner; or
31 32	(C) 1 year after the additional police hold was imposed; AND

37	§ 12-10. Release of stolen property.
38	(a) In general.
39	A dealer shall release to the Police Department any item in the dealer's possession if:

1	(1) the item is established to be stolen;	
2	(2) the owner of the item or the victim of the theft has:	
3	(i) positively identified the item; and	
4 5	(ii) provided an affidavit of ownership and made a report of the theft to a law enforcement agency;	
6	(3) the stolen property report describes the item by:	
7	(i) date;	
8	(ii) initials;	
9	(iii) an insurance record;	
10	(iv) a photograph;	
11	(v) a sales receipt;	
12	(vi) a serial number;	
13	(vii) specific damage;	
14	(viii) a statement of facts that show the item is one of a kind; or	
15	(ix) a unique engraving; and	
16	(4) the dealer is given a receipt for the item released.	
17 18 19	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED , That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior Ordinance.	
20 21	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED , That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30^{th} 90^{th} day after the date it is enacted.
