11	SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That
12	Ordinance 05-31, approved May 16, 2005, which granted permission to Printers' Square
13	Apartments Limited Partnership to use and maintain a private enclosed 3-story bridgeway
14	connecting a building known as 1310 Guilford Avenue to a building known as 1300/1314 Hunter
15	Street and located in an aerial easement over a portion of the Hunter Street right-of-way, is
16	hereby repealed.
17	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the provisions of this Ordinance shall
18	become effective at the time of the adoption of an ordinance to close a portion of Hunter Street
19	lying at the rear of 1310, 1312, and 1314 Guilford Avenue to public use and the passage of an
20	ordinance providing for the sale of the former street bed of the closed portion of Hunter Street to
21	Printers' Square Limited Partnership.
22	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the date it
23	is enacted.
