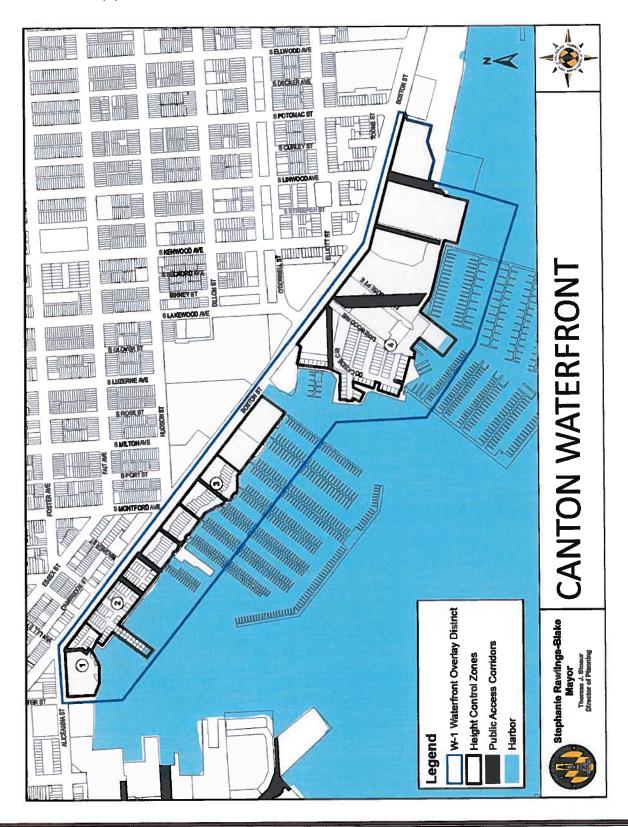

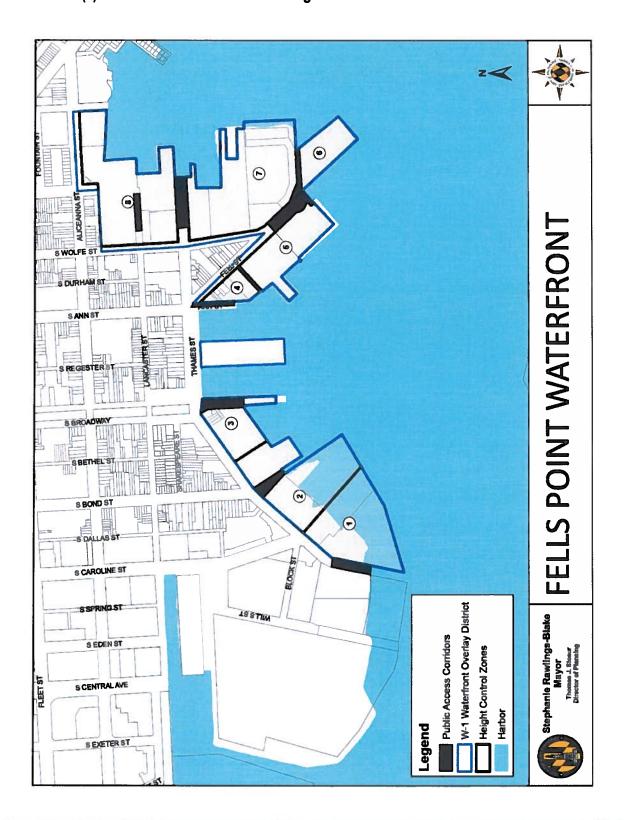
Height Limitations - The height of structures along the waterfront shall not exceed 35 feet, except in Areas 1 through 4. Height controls are provided in Areas 1 through 4 to minimize the impact of building heights on adjacent neighborhoods. Specific locations for higher buildings are provided, as well as guidelines for building setbacks and stepbacks. The maximum building height shall be defined as the vertical distance measured, in the case of flat roofs, from the mean curb level of the highest point of the roof adjacent to the street wall, and in the case of pitched roofs, from the mean curb level to the mean height level of the roof. 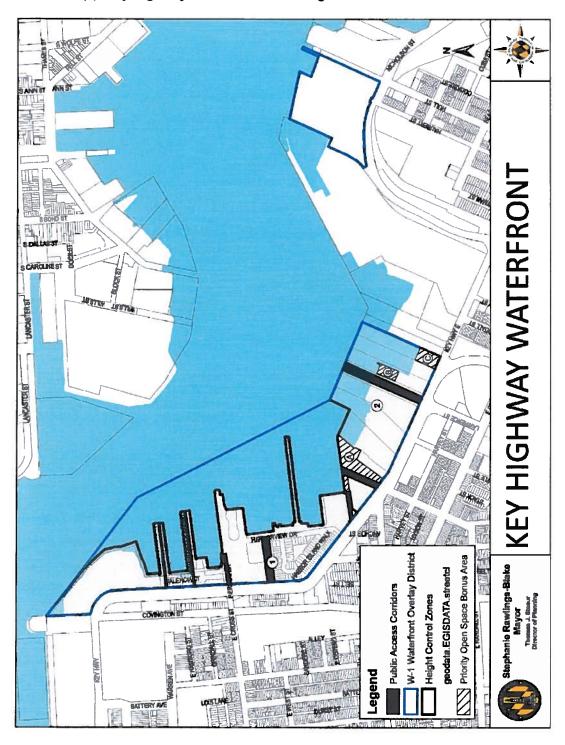

Public Access Corridors - In order to assure public access to the Pedestrian Promenade and to preserve and enhance views of the water, the following public access corridors may be designated. Offstreet parking is not permitted within these corridors, except following review and approval of the Commissioner of the Department of Housing and Community Development. 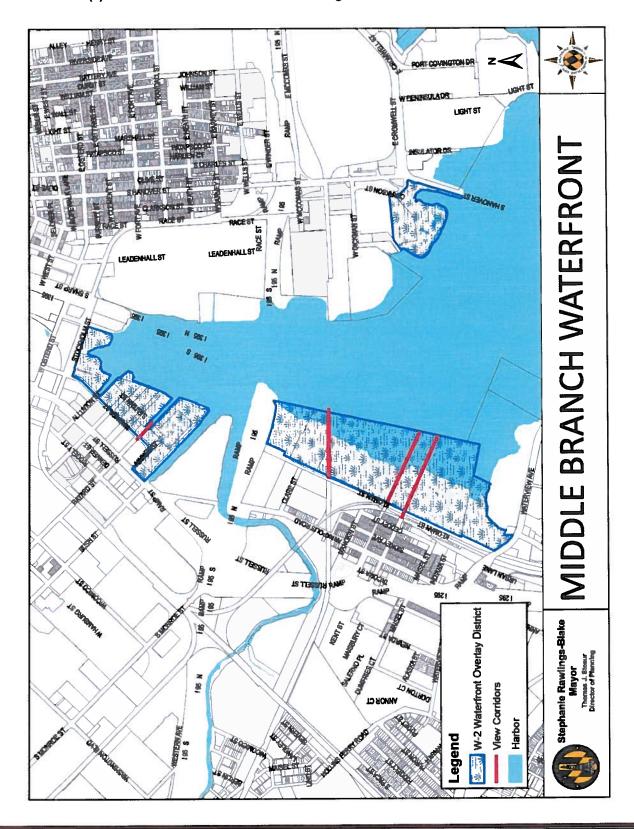

Table 15-405: Mount Vernon Neighborhood Height Map

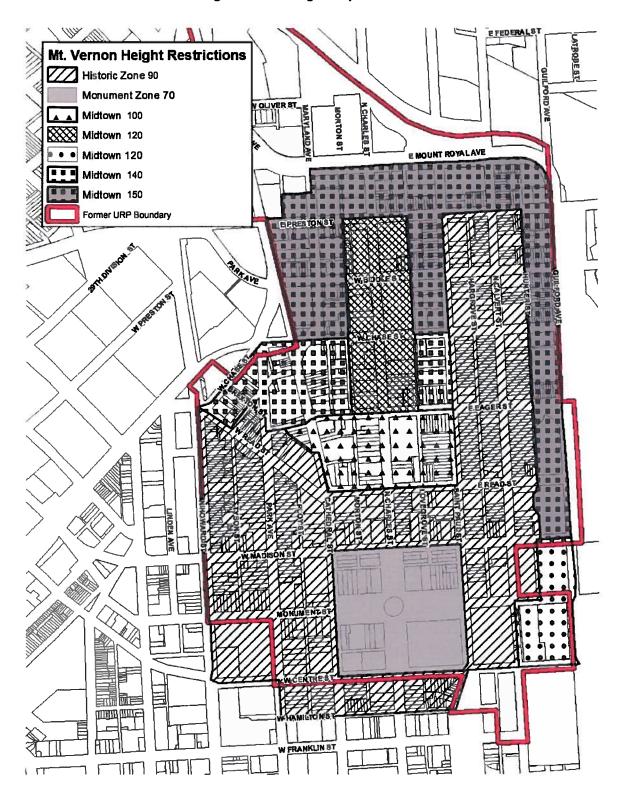
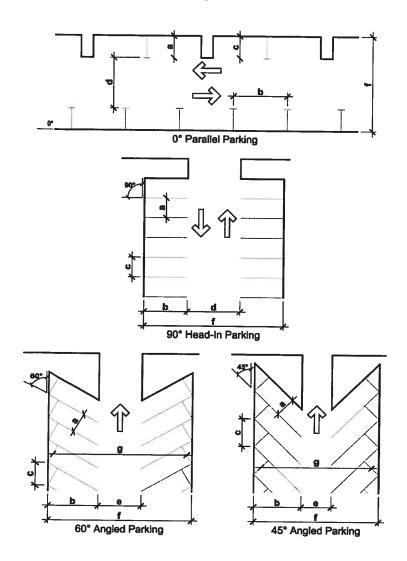
