3 4 5	(1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, no food dealer may provide purchasers of any product with a plastic bag (other than a reusable plastic bag) for us as a checkout or carryout bag.		
6 7 8	(2) This section does not apply to a food dealer who enrolls in the Plastic Bag Reduction Program established under this subtitle and complies with the requirements of the Program.		
9	(b) All dealers.		
10 11 12	(1) All dealers, whether of food or other goods, who offer to provide checkout or carryout bags must prominently post at their registers a policy of providing plastic bags only if requested by the customer.		
13 14	(2) §§ 16-10 {"Injunctive relief"}, 16-11 {"Enforcement by citation"}, and 16-13 {"Penalties"} do not apply to violations of this subsection.		
15	§ 16-7. Plastic Bag Reduction Program – Establishment and enrollment.		
16	(a) Program established.		
17 18	There is a Plastic Bag Reduction Program, to be administered and enforced by the Director of the Office of Sustainability.		
19	(b) Enrollment fee.		
20	The enrollment fee for the Program is as follows:		
21	(1) Enrollment on or before [August 31] November 30, 2010 – No fee.		
22	(2) Enrollment on or after [September] December 1, 2010 – \$500.
