Recitals

The revenue appropriated by this Ordinance represents \$2,000,000 from the Opioid
 Restitution Fund in excess of the revenue relied on by the Board of Estimates in determining the
 tax levy required to balance the budget for Fiscal Year 2025.

- This additional revenue could not have been reasonably anticipated when the Ordinance of
 Estimates for Fiscal Year 2025 was formulated.
- 19 This appropriation is made necessary by a material change in circumstances since the 20 Ordinance of Estimates for Fiscal Year 2025 was formulated or is for a new program that could 21 not have been reasonably anticipated when that Ordinance of Estimates was formulated.
- On December 18, 2024, the Board of Estimates recommended this appropriation to the City
 Council.

Council Bill 25-0012

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That 1 \$2,000,000 shall be made available to the Baltimore City Health Department – Service 307 2 (Health - Substance Use Disorder) as a Supplementary Special Revenue Fund Operating 3 Appropriation for Fiscal Year 2025, to provide funding for staffing and support costs for opioid 4 response and recovery strategies. The source of revenue for this appropriation is \$2,000,000 5 from the Opioid Restitution Fund in excess of the amount from this source that was relied on by 6 the Board of Estimates in determining the tax levy required to balance the budget for Fiscal Year 7 8 2025.

9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the date it is 10 enacted.
