

Council Bill 09-0181R

1 **WHEREAS**, Over three-fifths of residential applicants for the credit reported that they would
2 not have undertaken rehabilitation of their properties without the availability of the tax credit.

3 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE**, That the City
4 Council of Baltimore urges the Baltimore City House and Senate Delegations to the 2010
5 Maryland General Assembly and the Governor of Maryland to extend and expand the Maryland
6 Heritage Structure Rehabilitation Tax Credit, which has contributed greatly to Baltimore City
7 and to the State of Maryland as a whole, and which, without reauthorization, will expire in July
8 2010.

9 **AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, That a copy of this Resolution be sent to the Governor, the
10 Honorable Chair and Members of the Baltimore City House and Senate Delegations to the 2010
11 Maryland General Assembly, the Mayor, the Executive Director of the Maryland Municipal
12 League, the Executive Director of the Maryland Association of Counties, the Executive Director
13 of the Mayor's Office of State Relations, and the Mayor's Legislative Liaison to the City
14 Council.
