I am herein reporting on City Council Bill 14-0386 introduced by Council President Young at the request of the Department of Housing and Community Development.

The purpose of the Bill is to amend the Urban Renewal Plan for Oliver to reauthorize the acquisition of properties within the Project Area and remove certain properties from the lists in Appendices B and C; waive certain content and procedural requirements; make the provisions of this Ordinance severable; provide for the application of this Ordinance in conjunction with certain other ordinances; and provide for a special effective date.

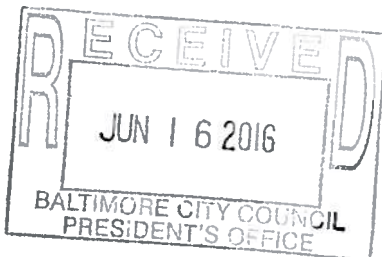
Ordinance 71-1067 established the Urban Renewal Plan for Oliver and was last amended by Ordinance 11-449. This area is primarily residential with some corner commercial establishments, churches, and the Great Blacks in Wax Museum. Ordinance 11-449 extended the acquisition and condemnation authority through and including December 31, 2014.

City Council Bill 14-0386, if approved, would reauthorize the Plan's powers of acquisition and condemnation so that these actions may legally continue in compliance with §12-105.1 of the Real Property Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland. In addition, the Bill would remove certain properties from the lists in Appendices B and C.

The Department of Public Works has no objection to the passage of City Council Bill 14-0386.
