Please be advised of the following comments offered on behalf of the Baltimore Commission on Sustainability (CoS). The CoS has reviewed the **City Council Bill # 12-0022** Sale of Properties – 1801 East Oliver Street and 1731 Llewelyn Avenue and is offering the following comments.

The intent of this bill addresses the following goals of the Baltimore Sustainability Plan as approved by City Council on March 2, 2009:

- Cleanliness Goal 3: Transform vacant lots from liabilities to assets that provide social and environmental benefits
- Pollution Prevention Goal 1: Reduce Baltimore's greenhouse gas emissions by 15% by 2015
- Resource Conservation Goal 4: Maximize reuse and recycling of materials

- Green Economy Goal 2: Make Baltimore a center for Green Business
