11 12	SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE , That the Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

15	Subtitle 1. Advertising Circulars		
16	§ 1-2. [Placement prohibited without permission] Prohibited Placements.		
17 18	A person may not affix, [or] place, OR CAUSE TO BE AFFIXED OR PLACED any advertising circular:		
19 20	(1) in or on any vehicle in the City f , except with the express permission of the owner or operator of the vehicle j ; or		
21 22	(2) in or on any residential property in the City (whether in or on a fence, railing, door, porch, lawn, sidewalk, or otherwise), except:

5	(A) IN GENERAL.
6	The person whose name, event, business, location, or merchandise is
7	ADVERTISED ON A CIRCULAR AFFIXED OR PLACED IN VIOLATION OF THIS SUBTITLE IS
8	PRESUMPTIVELY RESPONSIBLE FOR THE VIOLATION AND SUBJECT TO THE PENALTIES
9	IMPOSED UNDER THIS SUBTITLE.
0	(B) Overcoming presumption.
1	THE BURDEN OF OVERCOMING THE PRESUMPTION IS ON THE CONTESTING PARTY.
2	§ 1-4. [§ 1-3.] Enforcement by citation.
3	(a) In general.
14	In addition to any other civil or criminal remedy or enforcement procedure, this subtitle may be enforced by issuance of:
16 17	(1) an environmental citation under City Code Article 1, Subtitle 40 {"Environmental Control Board"}; or
8	(2) a civil citation under City Code Article 1, Subtitle 41 {"Civil Citations"}.
9	(b) Process not exclusive.
20	The issuance of a citation to enforce this subtitle does not preclude pursuing any other
21	civil or criminal remedy or enforcement action authorized by law.
22	§ 1-5. [§ 1-4.] Penalties.
23	(a) In general.
24	Any person who violates a provision of this subtitle is guilty of a misdemeanor and, on
25	conviction, is subject to a fine of not more than [\$100] \$500 for each offense.
26	(b) Each circular a separate offense.
27	Each ADVERTISING circular affixed or placed in violation of this subtitle constitutes a
28	separate offense.
