2 **Burglar Alarms – No Fees For User Registrations**

3 FOR the purpose of specifying that a burglar alarm user may not be charged a fee for registering  
4 an alarm with the Police Commissioner, lowering the fines for burglar alarm violations, and  
5 generally relating to the registration and regulation of burglar alarms.

21 **SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE,** That the

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**§ 8-5. Registration — Users.**

(C) *NO REGISTRATION FEE FOR USERS.*

A USER MAY NOT BE CHARGED ANY FEES FOR REGISTRATIONS OR RENEWALS OF REGISTRATIONS REQUIRED BY THIS SECTION.

**§ 8-8. False alarm fees.**

(b) *Fee Schedule.*

After 2 false alarms in any 12-month period, a false alarm fee is imposed for each false alarm, based on the following schedule:

<b>False alarms within 12-month period</b>	<b>Fee</b>
3 <sup>rd</sup>	\$ 50
4 <sup>th</sup>	100
5 <sup>th</sup>	150
6 <sup>th</sup>	200
7 <sup>th</sup>	250
8 <sup>th</sup>	300
9 <sup>th</sup>	[400] 350
10 <sup>th</sup>	[500] 400
11 <sup>th</sup>	[600] 450
12 <sup>th</sup> AND ABOVE	500

Commercial users	2,000
