Hi Lauren,

No, there is no AMTRAK or CSX approval of the route. The Record of Decision was signed by Federal Railroad Commission (FRC) – not all parties – it's not final. I've had a copy of this document for a long time including early correspondence.

The FRC agreed on a proposed route out of three, but it is not agreed to by the neighborhoods - reason for the RATT organization. Nothing is final and my proposed route is a much better solution – it requires further study.

The issue of freight rail transit could be resolved by another study, which I proposed to RATT. Looking at an area rail map for Baltimore, CSX has rail lines extending south of Fort McHenry toward the outer harbor. On the opposite shore is a complex of CSX freight lines. Seemed logical to me to connect freight rails through a two-way tunnel or tunnels and keep the other AMTRAK and MARC lines for passengers only – no freight through the new tunnels. This idea would reduce the safety issues experienced with the Howard rail (old B&O) tunnel, which allows freight.

Hi Paul,

No, I wasn't aware of the diagram that you created. Unfortunately, the timeframe in which Amtrak considered various options for the tunnel alternatives closed in 2017 following several years of study. This is documented in the Record of Decision, available on the project website. Additionally, I understand that federal safety laws require ventilation facilities at each end of the tunnel and the middle of the tunnel regardless of what types of properties the tunnel runs under - it has to do with emergency personnel access in case of catastrophe.

I do hope that you will review the proposal for the intermediate ventilation facility and provide comments based on the CHAP design guidelines for CHAP's advisory hearing.

Also, as Mount Royal Terrace Association is a consulting party in the <u>Section 106 Programmatic</u> <u>Agreement</u> (as is CHAP), I strongly encourage that Mount Royal Terrace Association's leadership provide their advisory comments on this proposal through the Section 106 consultative process when it is shared for comment.

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Hi Lauren,

Assume you do not know this, but a year ago and again last fall, I submitted the attached diagram to RATT and RHA to show a desired alternate route for the proposed rail tunnels; note the yellow line. This route, following North Avenue, reduces the chances to interfere with many historic sites, the Reservoir Hill neighborhood, several homes, private and commercial properties. By locating the tunnels here, eliminates the necessity to build a vent tunnel and locates the tunnel outlets just north of the existing BP tunnel. I never knew if this was ever presented to AMTRAK or City authorities, but it makes much better sense to me and maybe CHAP can support this idea too.



RESIDENTS AGAINST THE TUNNELS UPDATE

It was last year, August 2015, when an uncomfortable and frightening realization that the original proposal for two tunnels for passenger trains,

presented by the B & P Tunnel Project, had changed to four tunnels to accommodate double stacked freight. This major change could bring up to 388 trains PER DAY to run under our residential neighborhoods, under our HOMES! Cargo on these trains is not restricted. It could be anything from nuclear material, fracking oil, explosive chemicals, flammables and hazardous inhalables. Numerous conversations, phone calls and emails resulted in meetings, more meetings, seeking answers from every possible source to stop this serious threat to where we LIVE! Out of that despair and resentment, Residents Against the Tunnels, Inc. (RATT) was born. This article is an update on our struggle.

After several meetings, incorporation of RATT was initiated. Kathy Epple was voted President of RATT's nine member board. Then the tedious work of writing bylaws, applying for incorporation, creating committees, designing logos and letter heads, creating flyers, developing a website, networking with other groups, communicating with neighbors and developing an effective plan of action to stop this devastating threat to our families and homes. We were well on our way to becoming a force to reckon with.

During last winter, despite bitter cold weather, residents from Reservoir Hill, Penn North, Sandtown-Winchester, Easterwood, Bridgeview, Greenlawn, and Mondawmin along with some local politicians and others testified on record against these proposed tunnels. In the Spring, RATT attended Candidate Forums for Mayor and City Council races. We made sure concerns about railroad tunnels under our homes were discussed and awareness was raised. Yet that was only round one of what will be a lengthy process.

We are now leveraging additional resources to assist our efforts to stop these tunnels. Kathy, RATT's President, best sums up some recent activities, "We have consulted with various experts, formed some important partnerships, participated in the Draft Environmental Impact Statement hearing process and the mitigation process, met with some of our elected officials and held question and answer sessions with the B & P Tunnel Project Team. We have recently enlisted social work consultants to help spread the word and gain support from some of the neighborhoods to the west of Reservoir Hill."

Megan Belich and Ann Sherrill are the consultants. In future meeting you will hear from Megan, RATT's Community Organizer. We look forward to having you meeting Kelly Pfeifer, who will represent RATT on behalf of the Community Law Center (CLC).

It has been a long hard year of organizing and forming a team to serve our communities' best interests. And that team effort includes YOU! Here are some immediate ways you can help.

- We are printing 100 yard signs to get the word out to STOP THE TUNNELS. Please make a donation to cover the cost of a sign and put it in your yard or front window.
- 2) Share printed information with your neighborhood group, place of worship, etc.
- 3) Write, email and phone your Senators, Congressman, Delegates, and Councilmen to support efforts to STOP THE TUNNELS.
- 4) Take time to learn what is at stake in this battle and share that information with your neighbors.
- 5) And if you can contribute some time and money to help with printing, postage, phone calls, door knocking and all that is necessary to STOP THE TUNNELS....please do so!

Over the past year we have learned that these tunnels will pose a real risk of DANGERS that could

injure or kill thousands. The transport of hazardous cargo under our houses, and vibrations, noise, and pollution from these trains threaten our lives and can damage our homes and reduce health and quality of life. We have the power to STOP this project. Together we can let our Congressmen, Senators, and all elected officials know that they CAN NOT impose this project our communities! Because our communities MATTER and our LIVES MATTER!

Together we must work to save our neighborhoods and protect ourselves. Join in and do what you can to insure a safe, healthy and beautiful place to call home.
