Major Issues Discussed

- 1. Councilwoman Ramos, primary sponsor of the Resolution gave opening remarks, "This is a very important issue for students. During the hearing we will hear about their issues; students should have a voice in what is being served and/or what is included in school lunches."
- 2. The CEO for BCPS gave opening remarks stating, "I agree, this is an important issue." Some other highlights from her conversation were:
 - o Talked about the number of meals served in BCPS
 - o Thanked Councilwoman Ramos for introducing the Resolution and for given her the opportunity to a part of the conversation
 - o COVID have placed significant challenges on food services
 - Vacancies have also affected food services
- 3. The representative from BCPS' Food and Nutrition Division gave a PowerPoint Presentation. A copy is in the bill file
- 4. Three (3) students and a representative from the Bit Center testified. Some highlights from their conversations included:
 - Need better school lunches
 - o A better lunch will give students the energy needed to them through the day
 - School lunches for some low-income students is often the only meal they get during the day
 - o Have two (2) major issues
 - The amount of food thrown away and not consumed
 - Food is not tasty
 - We/students need a voice in the menu/type food being served
 - Students need future choices
 - Students are looking for things they love to eat
 - There is a commercial kitchen(s) in the new 21st Century buildings; no one cooks in it/them!
 - o There is over 530,000 tons or more of food wasted
 - We need to look at other systems to see what is working!
 - Supports Resolution
- 5. The committee/council members asked questions, made comments and/or asked for clarifications. Some highlights of same were:
 - o Comment: As a former teacher I can say, "there is always more room for nutrition
 - Applauded students for coming forth
 - o Supports Resolution
 - Comment: USDA Nutrition Requirement The students believe nutrition is there, but it
 is not enough; need more varieties
 - Ouestion: Is there an alternative choice for those students who are latex intolerant?

- Suggestion/Comment: Have any looked into composting since a lot of food is wasted?
- 6. Three (3) other speakers gave public testimony. Some highlights of same were:
 - A student stated he does not eat school lunches
 - Need a school store to purchase food and snacks
 - Vending machines are needed too
 - Students need fresh food, often don't get it; vegetables are not fresh
 - Quality of food is of concern
 - Need different options
 - Must eat lunch within 20 minutes is of concern
 - Per the Teacher who spoke:
 - Highlighted opportunities needed for students
 - o Their voices need to be heard
 - Students need to be better served
 - Need to have better choices available
 - O Student voices are needed in decision-making, and
 - Changing desires of students is not easy but a change is possible
