13	§ 55-6. Meetings; quorum.
14	(a) In general.
15 16	(1) The Advisory Commission [meets once per month.] SHALL MEET AT LEAST 2 TIMES EACH CALENDAR YEAR.
17 18	(2) The Advisory Commission may hold additional meetings, at the call of the Chair, as frequently as required to perform its duties.
19 20	(3) A majority of the members of the Advisory Commission constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business.
21	(4) An affirmative vote by the majority of a quorum is needed for any official action.
22	(b) <i>Rules of procedure</i> .
23	The Advisory Commission may adopt rules of procedure to govern its meetings and
24	procedures.
25	(c) Failure to attend meetings.
26 27	If any member is absent from regularly scheduled meetings more than [3 times] 1 TIME in 1 year, not counting absences excused by the Chair:
28	(1) the member is considered to have resigned; and
29 30	(2) the Chair must request that the member's appointing authority fill the resultant vacancy.

1	§ 55-7. PERSONNEL; BUDGET.
2	(A) <i>STAFF</i> .
3 4	THE CITY HEALTH DEPARTMENT SHALL PROVIDE ADEQUATE STAFF FOR THE ADVISORY COMMISSION TO CARRY OUT ITS DUTIES.
5	(B) VOLUNTEERS.
6 7	THE ADVISORY COMMISSION MAY ENGAGE THE SERVICES OF VOLUNTEER WORKERS, WITHOUT SALARY.
8	(C) BUDGET.
9 10	THE ADVISORY COMMISSION MAY EXPEND FUNDS AS AUTHORISED IN THE ORDINANCE OF ESTIMATES.
11	[§ 55-8. Volunteers.]
12	[The Advisory Commission may engage the services of volunteer workers, without salary.]
13	[§ 55-9. Budget.]
14	[The Advisory Commission may expend funds as authorised in the Ordinance of Estimates.]
15 16	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on date it is enacted.
