- <u>Baltimore Urban Leadership Foundation, aka The Door</u>: The Door hosted two listening sessions with a Likert survey distributed to everyone at the beginning. One was with young adults at the HEBCAC Yo! Center. The other was with neighborhood leaders based in East Baltimore at The Door Engagement Center.
- <u>Creative Nomads</u>: Creative Nomads hosted moderated conversations with families of young children.
- <u>Greater Baybrook Alliance:</u> The Greater Baybrook alliance conducted individual conversations with community residents (18 conversations total) that centered on Our Baltimore themes.
- <u>GEDCO: Govans Ecumenical Development Corporation</u>: GEDCO engaged residents at the Govans farmers market and at a community event.
- HARBEL: HARBEL hosted two outreach events related to their home buyer's program.
- <u>Immigration Outreach Service Center</u>: The Immigration Outreach Service Center in collaboration with Goose Feather Designs created surveys using the Survey Planet Application and sought responses from immigrants in the Baltimore area to questions that assessed four key areas under the broader scope of use of space in the city (Baltimore).
- <u>LUVS Art Project</u>: LUVS Art Project worked with a network of barbershops and beauty salons across Baltimore and hosted informal conversations.
- <u>McElderry Park Community</u>: McElderry Park invited Staff from the Department of Planning hosted a table at McElderry Park's Safe Streets/Throwback Thursday block party on July 28, 2022 on the 400 block of Montford Ave.
- <u>No Boundaries Coalition</u>: No Boundaries Coalition engaged youth through their annual Youth Issues Assembly. Based on the topics and ideas identified during the Youth Issues Assembly, No Boundaries Youth Organizers engaged peers at a National Night Out event on 8/2. In addition, on 7/11, ten No Boundaries Youth Organizers joined the Department of Planning for a workshop to

talk about careers related to urban planning, and collaboratively design youth engagement questions. Partnered with the Department of Planning to host Design Your City workshop for youth on August 1, 2022.

- <u>Outcast Food Network</u>: OFN conducted surveys, one-on-one conversations, a workshop, and further events to collect Our Baltimore data. Community residents were engaged during in-person food distribution sites. Additionally, OFN released 3 radio ads and used social media to promote the usage of the Our Baltimore survey. OFN collected 506 responses to a survey.
- <u>Pathway Forward</u>: Information tables were set up at four locations/events, including at St. John's AME Church, Stillmeadow Church, and two at Allen AME Church. The engagement was done through a brief survey and one-on-one conversation.
- <u>Rebuild Johnston Sq</u>: Rebuild Jonston Square organized game nights and other casual neighborhood events with food, games, and bingo, and incorporated three general questions related to the plan framework.
- <u>Southwest Partnership</u>: Engaged community members at events where they already were and were interested in having conversations (i.e., Sowebo Arts & Music Festival, health fair, Mount Clare neighborhood event, and at the local schools [Steuart Hill Elementary School and Vivien T. Thomas High School), through several methods, including a survey shared with our community networks, one on one conversation or sticky notes about key open-ended questions, workshop, etc.
- <u>We Our Us</u>: We Our Us spoke to residents at a "Baltimore Connect" meeting; at a Thriving Thursdays event organized by HeartSmiles; and by bringing Our Baltimore up for attention at a BYMOC (Boys and Young Men of Color) Mayors Cabinet meeting.
- <u>Youth Resiliency Institute:</u> Youth Resiliency Institute organizers surveyed residents of the Cherry Hill community through one-on-one conversations at Cherry Hill Town Center.
