I am herein reporting on City Council Bill 16-0683 City Streets – Opening – The Beds of Henneman Avenue and a 10-Foot Alley for the purpose of condemning and opening the beds of Henneman Avenue and a 10-foot alley bounded by East Biddle Street, North Wolfe Street, East Chase Street, and Rutland Avenue.

If enacted, this bill and companion bills 16-0684 (City Streets – Closing The Beds of Henneman Avenue, a 10-foot Alley, and a 20-Foot Alley) and 16-0685 (Sale of Property – The Former Beds of Henneman Avenue, a 10-Foot Alley and a 20-Foot Alley) would be part of the process necessary to close, and ultimately sell, a street and alley, that is no longer needed for public use, to support the development of a 6-acre, 3-block linear park in East Baltimore. The park will provide a safe and secure environment for individual recreation as well as a venue for programmed outdoor events such as farmer’s markets, concerts, and summer movie nights. The property is part of the EBDI development area.

DOT supports this bill.
