9	(A) TERMS OF OFFICE.	
10 11	(1) Advisory Board Members serve for a term of 4 years, concurrent with the terms of the Mayor and the City Council.	
12 13	(2) At the end of a term, an Advisory Board member continues to serve until a successor is appointed and qualifies.	
14	(B) Compensation; expenses.	
15	Members of the Advisory Board:	
16	(1) ARE NOT ENTITLED TO COMPENSATION FOR THEIR SERVICES; BUT	
17 18	(2) ARE ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES INCURRED, AS PROVIDED IN THE ORDINANCE OF ESTIMATES.	
19	(C) VACANCIES.	
20 21	A MEMBER APPOINTED TO FILL A VACANCY IN AN UNEXPIRED TERM SERVES ONLY FOR THE REMAINDER OF THAT TERM.	
22	§ 15-14. Officers; committees.	
23	(A) Officers.	
24 25	(1) The Mayor must designate a member of the Advisory Board to serve as its Chair.	
26 27	(2) Members of the Advisory Board may select any other officers they consider necessary or appropriate.	
28	(B) Committees.	
29 30	THE CHAIR MAY APPOINT COMMITTEES TO ASSIST THE ADVISORY BOARD IN CARRYING OUT ITS FUNCTIONS AND DUTIES.	

1	§ 15-15. Meetings; quorum.

3 4	(1) THE ADVISORY BOARD MAY MEET, AT THE CALL OF THE CHAIR, AS FREQUENTLY AS REQUIRED TO PERFORM ITS DUTIES.

7 8	(3) An affirmative vote by the majority of a quorum is needed for any official action.

13 14	If any member is absent from regularly scheduled meetings more than 3 times in 1 year, not counting absences excused by the Chair:
15	(1) THE MEMBER IS CONSIDERED TO HAVE RESIGNED; AND
16 17 18 19	(2) THE CHAIR MUST REQUEST THAT THE MEMBER'S APPOINTING AUTHORITY FILL THE RESULTANT VACANCY RECOMMEND FOR APPOINTMENT BY THE MAYOR, A REPLACEMENT MEMBER WITH SIMILAR QUALIFICATIONS TO THE RESIGNING MEMBER.

21 22	THE Advisory Board may engage the services of volunteer workers and consultants, without salary.
23	§ 15-17. BUDGET.
24 25	The Advisory Board may expend funds as authorized in the Ordinance of Estimates.
26	§ 15-18. Powers and duties.

28 29	THE BMORE STREETS FOR PEOPLE ADVISORY BOARD MAY UNDERTAKE THE ACTIVITIES DESCRIBED IN THIS SECTION.
30	(B) ROUTING AND PROGRAMMING.
31	THE ADVISORY BOARD MAY:

1 2	(1) PROPOSE PILOT AND PERMANENT ROUTES FOR THE BMORE STREETS FOR PEOPLE PROGRAM; AND	
3 4	(2) RECOMMEND PROGRAMMING ENHANCEMENTS AND OTHER SERVICES WHEN A NEED FOR THEM IS DETERMINED BY THE ADVISORY BOARD.	
5	(c) Advice.	
6	The Advisory Board may propose make recommendations about solutions and	
7 8	ALTERNATIVES FOR ROUTING CHALLENGES, PROGRAMMING, COMMUNICATION STRATEGIES, AND THE COST EFFECTIVE USE OF CITY PERSONNEL.	
9	(d) Research and education.	
0	To gauge the impact of the BMore Streets for People Program on participating communities, the Advisory Board must research and measure

17	(3) EVIDENCE OF ENHANCED SOCIABILITY AND HEALTHY ACTIVITIES.

20 21	(1) REVIEW AND MONITOR THE SUCCESSES AND LESSONS LEARNED IN CONDUCTING THE BMORE STREETS FOR PEOPLE PROGRAM IN BALTIMORE CITY; AND	
22	(2) MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS FOR PROMOTING THE EFFORTS OF THE PROGRAM.	
23	(F) ADVISE AND COUNSEL.

0	§ 15-21. Agency assistance {Reserved}.	
11 12 13	At the request of the Director or the Advisory Board, all City officials and agencies must extend the services and facilities required for the Program, including professional training of street control volunteers, to the extent that those officials and agencies are able to do so given their personnel and budgets.	
5	§ 15-22. Annual reports.	
16 17	The Director and the Advisory Board must submit an annual report on their activities to the Mayor and City Council.	
18 19 20	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED , That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior Ordinance.	
21	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the date it is enacted.
