AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING

Retirement Systems – Trustees – Conflicts

2 FOR the purpose of stating expressly the applicability of the City Ethics Code to the Board of Trustees for the Employees' Retirement System, the Board of Trustees for the Elected 3 4 Officials' Retirement System, the Board of Trustees for the Fire and Police Employees' 5 Retirement System, and their respective members and staff; establishing certain additional 6 ethics standards, restrictions, and requirements for members and staff of these Boards of 7 Trustees; excepting the Board of Trustees of the Employees' Retirement System from the requirements of City Charter Article IV, § 8; correcting, clarifying and conforming related 8 provisions; deleting certain obsolete provisions; and generally relating to the avoidance of 9 10 improper influence or even the appearance of improper influence on Trustees. By repealing and reordaining, with amendments 11 Article 22 - Retirement Systems 12

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16 **SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE**, That the 17 Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

1	The Board shall consist of 7 [trustees] TRUSTEES as follows:
2	(1) The Comptroller of the City of Baltimore, ex-officio.
3	(2) (I) 3 members of the system to be elected by the membership of the system, under
4	[such] rules and regulations [as may] be adopted by the Board of Trustees to
5	govern [such] THE election , to serve for a term of 4 years[,]. THESE MEMBERS
6 7	<u>SHALL SERVE FOR TERMS OF 4 YEARS EACH, STAGGERED AS PROVIDED FOR THE</u> TRUSTEES FIRST ELECTED UNDER THIS PARAGRAPH (2).
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8	(II) [provided, however] HOWEVER, [that] the term of office of the first 2
9	[trustees] TRUSTEES so elected shall begin immediately following their

17	served more than 2 years in office and who is granted an allowance or pension

19	Trustee for the balance of his or her term of office.

21	this subtitle, 1 of whom shall be a responsible officer of a bank authorized to do
22	business within the State of Maryland, or a person with similar experience, to be
23	appointed by the Mayor, with the consent of the City Council, as provided in
24	Article IV, § 6 of the City Charter, to. <u>THESE MEMBERS SHALL</u> serve for terms of
25	4 years each, provided, however, that immediately following February 23, 1926,
26	the Mayor shall appoint 1 [trustee] TRUSTEE to serve until January 1, 1927, and 1
27	[trustee] TRUSTEE to serve until January 1, 1929, such [trustees] TRUSTEES to
28	take office at appointment STAGGERED AS PROVIDED FOR THE TRUSTEES FIRST
29	APPOINTED UNDER THIS PARAGRAPH (3).
30	(4) 1 retiree of the system to be elected by the retirees under such rules and
31	regulations as may be adopted by the Board of Trustees to govern such THE
32	election, to. THIS MEMBER SHALL serve for a term of 4 years EACH, STAGGERED
33	AS PROVIDED FOR THE TRUSTEE FIRST ELECTED UNDER THIS PARAGRAPH (4). The
34	term of office of the retiree [trustee] TRUSTEE so elected shall begin following the
35	election and upon being sworn in. The initial term of office of the [trustee]
36	TRUSTEE so elected shall expire on January 1, 1996, and every 4 years thereafter.
37	The Mayor may appoint a retired member to serve as [trustee] TRUSTEE until such
38	time as an election for office is held.

16	(4) The Director of Finance, ex officio. The Director of Finance may designate a
17	representative to attend any meeting of the Board of Trustees in his or her place.
18	This representative must be either the Deputy Director of Finance or the Budget
19	Director. This representative has the authority to act in the Director of Finance's
20	place.
21	(5) (i) 3 residents and registered voters of the City of Baltimore, to be appointed by
22	the Mayor with the consent of the City Council, as provided in City Charter
23	Article IV, § 6, each to serve for a term of 4 years concurrent with the Mayor's
24	term of office. 1 of these 3 [trustees] TRUSTEES shall be appointed by the
25	Mayor from a list of 3 recommended candidates submitted by the President of
26	the City Council.
27	 (ii) These [trustees] TRUSTEES shall possess commercial banking, investment
28	banking, accounting, actuarial, auditing, investment management, investment
29	consulting, or financial legal expertise.
