12	In 1968, Mr. Konstantine Prevas, World War II veteran, attorney, and leader in
13	Baltimore's Greek Community, was a member of the Baltimore City Board of
14	Fire Commissioners. Although there had been, in 1953, a desegregation decision
15	by the Board of Fire Commissioners, barriers of discrimination still remained,
16	including segregation in the fire house. Mr. Prevas cast the deciding vote to
17	ensure impartiality, equality, and scrutiny of the system for all members of the
18	Baltimore City Fire Department.
19	SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the
20	Fire Station, home of Truck Company #20 and Squad #11 and located at 5714 Eastern Avenue, is
21	named the Konstantine Prevas Fire Station.
22	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30 <sup>th</sup> day

after the date it is enacted.
