12 13	SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

15	Article 22. Retirement Systems
16	Subtitle – Fire and Police Employees' Retirement System
17	§ 34. Benefits.
18	(f-2) Allowance on 100% line-of-duty disability retirement.
19 20	(1) Any member who retires on a 100% line-of-duty disability shall receive a retirement allowance that consists of:
21 22	(i) an annuity that is the actuarial equivalent of the member's accumulated contributions at the time of retirement; [and] PLUS
23 24	(ii) a pension that[, together with the annuity,] equals 100% of the member's regular compensation at the time of retirement.

1 2 3 4 5 6	(2) For purposes of computing the pension payable to the member, if the last injury that caused or contributed to the disability occurred while the member was assigned to duties in a higher classification than his or her regular classification, the member's compensation shall be based on the maximum rate of pay earnable in the classification in which she or he was performing duties at the time of the injury causing the disability.
7 8	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED , That the increase in benefits established by this Ordinance applies to all persons who:
9 10	(a) in accordance with Article 22, § 34, retire on a 100% line-of-duty disability after the effective date of this Ordinance, and
11 12	(b) on the effective date of this Ordinance, are receiving a 100% line-of-duty disability under Article 22, § 34, retroactively to the date of their retirement.
13 14 15	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED , That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior Ordinance.
16 17	SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED , That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30 th day after the date it is enacted.
