1 AN ORDINANCE concerning

2 **Walters Art Gallery - Disposition of Art Objects**

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Trustees of the Walters Art Gallery to exchange, sell, or
4 otherwise dispose of certain objects that are not useful to the collection; and providing for a
5 special effective date.

11 **Recitals**

12 The Walters Art Gallery possesses certain objects that are of a character and
13 condition that render them unsuitable for public exhibition.

14 The deaccessioning of these objects has been recommended by the Board of
15 Trustees of the Walters Art Gallery.

16 **SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE,** That the
17 Trustees of the Walters Art Gallery are hereby authorized to exchange, sell or otherwise dispose
18 of the objects on the list attached to and made part of this Ordinance, entitled "List of Objects
19 Slated for Deaccessioning."

20 **SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** That this Ordinance takes effect on the date it
21 is enacted.

3 European, 13th Century, limestone
4 Acquired by William T. or Henry Walters, probably before 1931
5 # 27.578

- 6 2. Pair of Columns
7 French, capitals are 13th Century, shafts are modern, bases are probably modern, limestone
8 Acquired by Henry Walters 1922
9 # 27.260

- 10 3. Pair of Columns with Cosmatesque Mosaic Work
11 Italian, stone, glass tesserae, probably modern (probably thought by Henry Walters to be 12th
12 Century)
13 Acquired by Henry Walters in 1925
14 # 27.379/27.380
