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**AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING**

**Zoning – Conditional Use Amendment –  
801 Beaumont Avenue**

FOR the purpose of amending the maximum bed capacity for the convalescent, nursing, and rest home (assisted living) on the property known as 801 Beaumont Avenue, as outlined in red on the accompanying plat.

**SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE,** That the Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

**Ordinance 02-435**

**SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE,** That permission is granted for the establishment, maintenance, and operation of a convalescent, nursing, and rest home (assisted living) on the property known as 801 Beaumont Avenue, as outlined in red on the plat accompanying this Ordinance, in accordance with Zoning Code §§ 4-204(2) and 14-102 of the Baltimore City Code, subject to the following conditions:

Underlining indicates matter added to the bill by amendment.  
~~Strike out~~ indicates matter stricken from the bill by amendment or deleted from existing law by amendment.

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- 1           1. The maximum number of residents is [7] 8, including a resident manager.
- 2           2. There may be no more than 2 clients per sleeping room.
- 3           3. Sleeping rooms for clients may not be in the basement.
- 4           4. The minimum age for resident-clients is 50 years.
- 5           5. 24-hour supervision must be provided.
- 6           6. There may be no exterior sign on the facility other than a nameplate no larger  
7           than 6 inches wide by 6 inches high.
- 8           7. The convalescent, nursing, and rest home (assisted living) must comply with all  
9           applicable federal, state, and local licensing and certification requirements.

10           **SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** That as evidence of the authenticity of the  
11           accompanying plat and in order to give notice to the agencies that administer the City Zoning  
12           Ordinance: (i) when the City Council passes this Ordinance, the President of the City Council  
13           shall sign the plat; (ii) when the Mayor approves this Ordinance, the Mayor shall sign the plat;  
14           and (iii) the Director of Finance then shall transmit a copy of this Ordinance and the plat to the  
15           Board of Municipal and Zoning Appeals, the Planning Commission, the Commissioner of  
16           Housing and Community Development, the Supervisor of Assessments for Baltimore City, and  
17           the Zoning Administrator.

18           **SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30<sup>th</sup> day  
19           after the date it is enacted.
