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Major Issues Discussed

1. Chairwoman Sharon Green Middleton opened the meeting, introduced committee members and City representatives and read the bill into the record.
 2. Martin French testified on behalf of the Planning Commission. He presented the agency's report, findings and recommendations. He also presented the Planning Commission's amendments. The parking lot will create additional parking for people with disabilities. He explained the stormwater management plan for the site.
 3. Agency representatives testified on behalf of their respective agencies.
 4. The committee discussed the site plan, displaced parking, handicapped parking and community concerns.
 5. The committee opened the hearing for public testimony.
 6. David Greenberg testified in support of the bill. He explained that the State of Maryland provided over \$1 million to help expand disability services offered at the facility. The proposed site enhancements will help rid the area of several dilapidated properties. The League notified community organizations and discussed the proposed plans for the site. The majority of the community supports the parking lot.
 7. The Honorable Regina Boyce shared that the 43Rd District Delegation met with Councilmember Dorsey regarding community and housing enhancements for the area.
 8. Community residents expressed concerns about nefarious off-hour activities, trash and public safety in the area. Some did not have concern about parking during election cycles. Support was expressed for accessible parking for the disabled. Mr. Greenberg was encouraged to work with residents to address related issues.
 9. The committee received communications in support of and in opposition to the bill.
 10. Councilmember Dorsey expressed his opposition to the bill.
 11. The committee approved amendments.
 12. The committee voted to recommend the bill favorably with amendments.
 13. The hearing was adjourned.
