7	(2) JULY 15 FOR THE APRIL THROUGH JUNE QUARTER;
8	(3) OCTOBER 15 FOR THE JUNE THROUGH SEPTEMBER QUARTER; AND
9	(4) JANUARY 15 FOR THE OCTOBER THROUGH DECEMBER QUARTER.
