

Baltimore City's Patty Centers

- **United Way Excel Academy** (2022): Designed to meet the needs of teen parents and their young children who are enrolled in this alternative high school in the Poppleton neighborhood in west Baltimore. Wrap around Family Support services remove the barriers that lead to many teen parents dropping out of school.
- **RISE Early Learning and Family Support Center** (2023): Operates under the umbrella of the Center for Restorative Change within the UMD School of Social Work. In collaboration with Family Connections Baltimore and B'More for Healthy Babies the center acts as a community hub to support multi-generational caregivers and their children to support the safety, stability and growth of children and families in the community.
- **Goodwill Excel Center Adult High School** (2024): Located in downtown Baltimore, Goodwill Excel provides family support services to those enrolled in the Adult High School. This center provides a robust workforce development and post-secondary track for parents upon diploma completion.



LOCATE: Child Care


- Maryland's only formal, statewide child care resource and referral system based on up-to-date licensure data.
- Maryland Family Network's free service that connects families to trusted, regulated child care and supports providers with free marketing to fill openings.
- For more than 30 years, it has anchored Maryland's child care infrastructure and given policymakers real-time data on supply and demand.

Building Maryland's child care supply—one provider at a time.

- GOFCC is an innovative initiative that builds child care supply in high-need communities where there are too few licensed child care by helping aspiring providers build stable, high-quality child care businesses.

The Process

1. Targeted Recruitment

Outreach in child care deserts and high-need communities

2. Licensing Navigation

One-on-one coaching through all Office of Child Care licensing requirements

3. Business Foundations

Training in contracts, policies, marketing, fee structures, and taxes

4. Quality & Sustainability

Support for Maryland EXCELS, Child Care Scholarship, and technology tools




Providers & Capacity in Baltimore City

- Baltimore City represents 9% of total child care capacity in the state of Maryland and 10% of all providers


Total Child Care Capacity by Provider Type

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
Number of Active Family Providers by Year

Baltimore City vs. Rest of Maryland




Early Head Start in Baltimore City

- Baltimore City represents 12% of total EHS capacity in the state of Maryland and 22% of all EHS providers


Early Head Start Enrollment by Year*

No. Active Early Head Start Providers by Year*



LOCATE Search Traffic in Baltimore City

- Baltimore City represents roughly *one third* of all LOCATE search volume in the last nine months, with searches spiking in September 2025



- 61 new programs have received licensure in Baltimore City, creating 416 seats of additional child care capacity since July 1, 2024




