18	For any location where street parking, whether metered or unmetered, has
19	BEEN MADE AVAILABLE TO THE GENERAL PUBLIC, NO DEPARTMENT, AGENCY, OR UNIT OF
20	THE CITY (INCLUDING THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, THE PARKING
21	AUTHORITY, OR THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS) MAY ISSUE A MINOR PRIVILEGE
22	PERMIT, SPECIAL PARKING PASS, OR OTHER PERMISSION THAT SUSPENDS OR SUPERSEDES
23	THE RIGHT OF THE GENERAL PUBLIC TO PARK IN THAT LOCATION WHILE ALLOWING
24	SPECIFIC PERSONS OR THEIR DESIGNEES TO PARK THERE.

2	This section does not apply to a permit, pass, or other permission:
3	(1) ISSUED TO ACCOMMODATE A FUNERAL OR A WEDDING; OR
4 5	(2) OBTAINED UNDER THE AUSPICES OF THE CITY'S DIVISION OF FILM, VIDEO, AND TELEVISION.
6 7 8	<b>SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED</b> , That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior Ordinance.
9 10	<b>SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED</b> , That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30 <sup>th</sup> day after the date it is enacted.
