The staff to the Commission for Historical and Architectural Preservation (CHAP) is in receipt of City Council Bill #16-0697, which is for the purpose of establishing a tax credit against the property tax imposed on the principal residences of certain public safety officers; imposing certain limitations, conditions, and qualifications for credit eligibility; providing for the amount, duration, and administration of the credit; defining certain terms; providing for a special effective date; and generally relating to a property tax credit for qualified public safety officers.

The CHAP staff has prepared a report for the Commission to hear at their monthly hearing on August 9, 2016. The report recommends a finding of no opposition to this bill, as there will be no impact on historic resources.
