> City Council Bill 11-0699 - Zoning - Planned Unit Developments-Re: Variances

Dear President and City Council Members:

The Law Department has reviewed City Council Bill 11-9699 for form and legal sufficiency. The bill amends the City's Zoning Code to expand the instances in which variances may be granted by ordinance. Currently, a variance may be granted in an ordinance that authorizes a conditional use. This bill would amend the Zoning Code to allow the granting of a variance in any ordinance authorizing a Planned Unit Development ("PUD") or in any ordinance modifying either a PUD or a conditional use.

The City's Zoning Code must be amended in order to allow for these changes because Section 2.08(c)(2) of Article 66B of the Maryland Code requires the City's general zoning ordinance (i.e. the Zoning Code) to specify when the City Council is allowed to grant variances. special exceptions or conditional uses. Md Code, Art. 66B, §2.08(c)(2).

The City Council may want to consider amending Section 15-302 of the Zoning Code to be clear that procedure used to grant variances in ordinances for conditional uses will be the same for these additional types of ordinances in which a conditional use can be granted.

Any amendment to the City's Zoning Code requires advertisement by publication in a newspaper of general circulation in the City at least 15 days before the hearing. See Md Code, Art. 66B, §2.04(b)(2)(1); Zoning Code of Baltimore City, §§16-101(d)(2); 16-402(b)(1); 16-402(c)(2). In addition, any Zoning Legislation, such as this bill, requires a Third Reading holdover before final passage by the Council. See Zoning Code of Baltimore City, §16-404(5).

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Assuming this bill was properly advertised and is held-over before Third Reading, the Law Department approves it for form and legal sufficiency.
