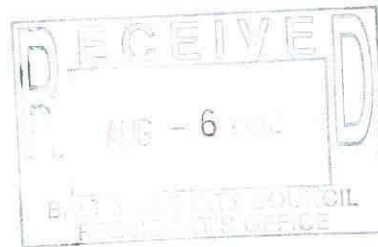
I am herein reporting on City Council Bill 12-0074 introduced by Council Members Clarke and Curran.

The purpose of the Bill is to amend the Urban Renewal Plan for Waverly Business Area to add the property known as 3313-3319 Greenmount Avenue to those properties designated for acquisition, by revising Exhibit 2, “Property Acquisition” of the Plan and to add the property known as 3313-3319 Greenmount Avenue to those properties designated for disposition by revising Exhibit 3, “Land Disposition” of the Plan; waive certain content and procedural requirements; make the provisions of this Ordinance severable; and provide for the application of this Ordinance in conjunction with certain other ordinances.

Ordinance 79-1029 established the Urban Renewal Plan for Waverly Business Area and was last amended by Ordinance 11-470. The Waverly Business Area is centered along Greenmount Avenue, between East 29<sup>th</sup> Street and East 35<sup>th</sup> Street and along eastern portions of East 33<sup>rd</sup> Street and Old York Road.

City Council Bill 12-0074, if approved, would amend the Urban Renewal Plan to add the property known as 3313-3319 Greenmount Avenue to the list of properties designated for acquisition and for disposition.

The Department of Public Works has no objection to the passage of City Council Bill 12-0074.
