9 **WHEREAS**, The Community Conferencing Center, a non-profit organization, proposes to
10 undertake a project to conduct a community-based crime and conflict resolution initiative in
11 Baltimore City designed to prevent and reduce crime through the use of community
12 conferencing; and

13 **WHEREAS**, The Community Conferencing Center has applied to the Department of Housing
14 and Community Development of the State of Maryland for approval of the project and an
15 allocation of tax credits for business entities and individuals that contribute to the project, under
16 the Department's Community Investment Tax Credit Program; and

17 **WHEREAS**, The regulations of the Department of Housing and Community Development of
18 the State of Maryland require the written expression of the sentiment of the Baltimore City
19 Council.

20 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE**, That the City
21 Council of Baltimore:

- 22 1. Hereby endorses this October 2010 application of the Community Conferencing
23 Center for a project to conduct a community-based crime and conflict resolution
24 initiative in Baltimore City designed to prevent and reduce crime through the use of
25 community conferencing.

27 Housing and Community Development of the State of Maryland, the Honorable
