3	For the purpose of amending the Urban Renewal Plan for the York-Woodbourne Business Area
4	to reauthorize the acquisition of properties within the Project Area and to correct and clarify
5	certain language; waiving certain content and procedural requirements; making the
6	provisions of this Ordinance severable; providing for the application of this Ordinance in
7	conjunction with certain other ordinances; and providing for a special effective date.

13	Recitals
14	The Urban Renewal Plan for York-Woodbourne was originally approved by the Mayor and
15	City Council of Baltimore by Ordinance 74-650 and last amended by Ordinance 95-667.
16	An amendment to the Urban Renewal Plan for the York-Woodbourne Business Area is
17	necessary to reauthorize the Plan's powers of acquisition and condemnation so that these actions
18	may legally continue, in compliance with § 12-105.1 of the Real Property Article of the
19	Annotated Code of Maryland, and to correct and clarify certain language.
20	Under Article 13, § 2-6 of the Baltimore City Code, no substantial change may be made in
21	any approved renewal plan unless the change is approved in the same manner as that required for
22	the approval of a renewal plan.
23	SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the
24	following change changes in the Urban Renewal Plan for the York-Woodbourne Business Area
25	is are approved:
26	(1) In the Plan, amend C.1.a.(1) and (2) to read as follows:

AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the Urban Renewal Plan for York-Woodbourne Business Area, as amended by this Ordinance and identified as "Urban Renewal Plan York-Woodbourne Business Area, revised to include Amendment 9, dated December 6, 2010", is approved. The Department of Planning shall file a copy of the amended Urban Renewal Plan with the Department of Legislative Reference as a permanent public record, available for public inspection and information.
26	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That if the amended Urban Renewal Plan
27	approved by this Ordinance in any way fails to meet the statutory requirements for the content of
28 29	a renewal plan or for the procedures for the preparation, adoption, and approval of a renewal plan, those requirements are waived and the amended Urban Renewal Plan approved by this
30	Ordinance is exempted from them.
3 1	SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That if any provision of this Ordinance or the
32	application of this Ordinance to any person or circumstance is held invalid for any reason, the
33 34	invalidity does not affect any other provision or any other application of this Ordinance, and for this purpose the provisions of this Ordinance are declared severable.
35	SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That if a provision of this Ordinance concerns
36	the same subject as a provision of any zoning, building, electrical, plumbing, health, fire, or

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1 2 3 4	safety law or regulation, the applicable provisions shall be construed to give effect to each. However, if the provisions are found to be in irreconcilable conflict, the one that establishes the higher standard for the protection of the public health and safety prevails. If a provision of this Ordinance is found to be in conflict with an existing provision of any other law or regulation that
5	establishes a lower standard for the protection of the public health and safety, the provision of
5	this Ordinance prevails and the other conflicting provision is repealed to the extent of the
7	conflict.
8	SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED , That this Ordinance takes effect on the date it is enacted.
