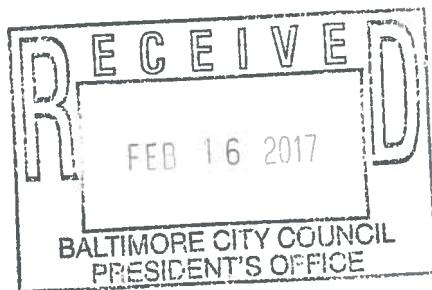

Re: City Council Bill 16-0002 – City Property – Naming the Park Located at 1900-2100
Mount Royal Terrace, Lady Baltimore Park

Dear President and City Council Members:

The Law Department has reviewed City Council Bill 17-0002 for form and legal sufficiency. Article 5, Subsection 20 of the City Code requires that property owned by the Mayor and City Council be renamed by ordinance. *See* City Code, Article 5, §20-1, *et. seq.* The municipal agency that “has or will have control over the property” must be referred the bill for comment, in addition to the Planning Commission and the Department of Real Estate. *See* City Code, Article 5, §20-2(b). Presumably the Department of Recreation and Parks is the agency that controls this property and has followed its policy regarding naming of park property. Provided that is the case, the Law Department approves the bill for form and legal sufficiency.
