9 10	SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

15	(A) Scope of Section.			
16	(1) EXCEPT AS SPECIFIED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THIS SECTION APPLIES			
17	WHENEVER PARKING ON A STREET IS TO BE TEMPORARILY DISCONTINUED OR			
18	OTHERWISE RESTRICTED BY THE CITY OR OTHER PERSON TO ACCOMMODATE			
19	CONSTRUCTION, REPAIR, OR OTHER WORK TO BE DONE ON OR ADJACENT TO THE			
20	STREET, OR A SPECIAL EVENT.			
21	(2) This section does not apply in the case of an emergency, where the work on			
22	OR ADJACENT TO THE STREET MUST BE DONE IMMEDIATELY TO PROTECT LIFE, HEALTH,			
23	SAFETY, OR PROPERTY.

2 3 4	(1) The City <u>agency or other person responsible for work to be done</u> shall post the affected area with advance notice of the parking restrictions at least $\frac{5}{3}$ <u>calendar</u> days before the restrictions become effective.
5	(2) The posted notice shall include:
6	(I) THE DATES AND TIMES WHEN THE RESTRICTIONS WILL BE EFFECTIVE;
7 8	(II) THE NAME OF THE CITY AGENCY OR OTHER PERSON RESPONSIBLE FOR THE WORK TO BE DONE <u>OR SPECIAL EVENT</u> ;
9	(III) A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE WORK TO BE DONE OR SPECIAL EVENT; AND
10 11	(IV) A PHONE NUMBER AND EMAIL ADDRESS AT WHICH FURTHER INFORMATION CAN BE OBTAINED.
12	(c) Prior notice – Delivery.
13 14 15 16 17	(1) If a violation of the temporary parking restrictions will authorize impoundment, the City <u>agency or other person responsible for work to be done</u> shall also give written notice to the occupants of the properties abutting the affected area at least \$\frac{5}{2}\$ calendar days before the restrictions become effective.
18	(2) This written notice shall include:
19 20	(I) THE INFORMATION REQUIRED BY SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION FOR THE POSTED NOTICE; AND
21 22	(II) A PROMINENT WARNING THAT THE PARKING RESTRICTIONS MAY BE ENFORCED BY IMPOUNDMENT.
23 24 25	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED , That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior Ordinance.
26 27	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30 th day after the date it is enacted.
